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MORNING PRAYERS

1) The Morning Offering (said privately)

O my God, in union with the Immaculate Heart of Mary, I offer thee the precious Body and Blood of Jesus from all the Catholic altars throughout the world, joining with this Holy Eucharist the offering of my every thought, word, and action of this day. O my Jesus, I desire today to gain every merit I can and I offer them, together with myself, to Mary Immaculate that she may best apply them to the interests of thy most Sacred Heart.

Most Precious Body and Blood of Jesus, save us! Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us! Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us!

2) RJMI Morning Prayer (said privately)

O my Lord God, I would like to thank thee above all things, simply for thyself, for thy great goodness and wonderful kindness; and then for the great goodness and wonderful kindness of thy greatest masterpiece, thy mother and my holy mother, Mary; and then for the great goodness and wonderful kindness of all the angels and saints in heaven.

I would like to thank thee, Lord God, for all the graces and other helps thou hast given me, first and foremost for the sanctification of my own soul, and then for the sanctification and salvation of others, and then for my temporal needs, for every breath and step I take.

And I pray that thou wilt grant me a perfect and pure fear *(bow your head)*, love, faith, hope, and trust in thee and enable me to carry my cross this day in complete and total resignation to thy holy will, and to do so joyfully as proof that I am not complaining.

And I pray that thou wilt protect me from all sins and faults during this day. And if I should commit a sin or fault, make me aware of it forthwith so that I may confess it, amend my life, and do works of satisfaction for it so that I may become perfect and holy as thou art perfect and holy. From my secret sins cleanse me, O Lord, and from those of others spare thy servant. Let not my heart turn aside to wicked deeds to make excuses for sins.

I pray, O Lord, that thou wilt protect me from the devils and damned humans when they attempt to possess, obsess, or tempt me. And if they attempt to do so, may it be the greatest cause of pain and agony to them. Protect me from any curses anyone tries to throw upon me, and may the curses go back upon their own heads sevenfold.

I would like to thank thee, O Lord, for allowing my Guardian Angel to protect me from the attacks of the devils and damned humans and my own concupiscence during my dreams last night so that first and foremost the ungodly dreams don't take root in me, and then for protecting me from pollution. And may thou grant me the same protection during this day.

I now pray the St. Michael prayer and the St. Benedict prayer to punish, torture, and torment all the devils, damned humans, and living humans who attacked Catholics and men of good will in the previous day, directly and indirectly, exteriorly and interiorly. And may these prayers be a great source of pain and agony to them. (*Pray the Exorcism Prayer of St. Michael the Archangel and the Exorcism Prayer of St. Benedict.*)

3) Spiritual Communion and Corpus et Sanguinis Christi (said privately)

If you did not receive Holy Communion, then pray the Spiritual Communion. After Holy Communion or spiritual communion, pray the Corpus et Sanguinis Christi.

My Jesus, I believe that thou art really present in the most Blessed Sacrament of the Altar. I love thee above everything else, and I long to receive thee into my soul. I cannot now receive thee in Holy Communion, but I beg thee to come to me at least spiritually. I embrace thee as already there and unite myself entirely to thee. Grant that I may never be separated from thee!

Body of Christ, save me;
Blood of Christ, inebriate me;
Divinity of Christ, sanctify me;
Water from the side of Christ, wash me;
Passion of Christ, strengthen me;
Oh my good Jesus, hear me;
Within thy wounds hide me;

¹ If pollution (the spilling of the male seed) occurred in sleep, then pray, "O Lord, please let me know if this pollution occurred because of a current sin I am guilty of and hence needs to be confessed; or if it occurred to keep me humble and aware of my own weakness, or for penance due to my sins, or to gain grace for others." If you fell into sin in a dream, you are not guilty. But you should still pray this prayer.

Prayers all Catholics must do

- The Morning Prayers and Night Prayers.²
- Pray one Rosary (5 decades) and one Angelic Chaplet a week.
- On Maundy Day, pray the Holy Hour any time between 12 midnight and 6am.
- On Good Sixth Weekday, pray the Stations of the Cross and the Seven Penitential Psalms.
- On a first seventh weekday of a month, do or attend at least one long exorcism prayer during the year.
- Read the *Roman Martyrology* for the current day from the RJMI revised *Roman Martyrology* accessed on the Pastoral Menu. Before you read it, say, "May the blood of the martyrs descend upon us and grant us a blessing from the lord in this [say the Day and Month; for example, on this 1st day of the 12 th month.]" And after the ending say, "L. And in many other places, many holy martyrs, confessors, and virgins, R. Thanks be to God."
- Attend Mass on the Lord's Day and other days of obligation if possible. If a Catholic Mass is not available, pray the Mass prayers instead: the Introit, Collect, Lesson, Epistle, the prayers after the Epistle and before the Gospel, the Gospel, Creed, Offertory, Secret, Communion, and Postcommunion.
- It is also good, and even necessary, to speak spontaneously to God, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the angels and saints, regarding your needs, desires, and other petitions and regarding your feelings and in thanksgivings and acts of love and devotion.

Do not expect to be lifted up to the third heaven every time you pray. Pray as a duty, as a military duty, even when you feel no inspiration or are distracted, as God will see that you are praying for love of him and not for the reward of feeling good. Most times you pray, you will not be lifted up and many times you will be distracted, but pray anyway and you will see the great results. God will come to you and inspire you in his good time, when and where he sees fit. Most times God will inspire you when you are reading the scriptures or studying the faith. But he will

even inspire you when you are recreating or doing every day activities.

Prayers and Creed to memorize

L. Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. R. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Glory Be

L. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. R. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, forever and ever. Amen.

Apostles' Creed

L. I believe in God the Father almighty and in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into the underworld; the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and sitteth at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from thence he shall come to judge the living and the dead. R. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the remission of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

Act of Contrition

O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended thee; and I detest all my sins because I dread the loss of heaven and the pains of Gehenna, but most of all because they offend thee, my God, who art all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of thy grace, to confess my sins, to do works of satisfaction, and to amend my life. Amen.

Confiteor

I confess to Almighty God, to Blessed Mary ever Virgin, to blessed Michael the Archangel, to blessed John the Baptist, to the holy apostles Peter and Paul, to all the saints, and to you, brethren, that I have sinned exceedingly in thought, word, and deed, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault. Therefore I beseech Blessed Mary ever Virgin, blessed Michael the Archangel, blessed John the Baptist, the holy apostles Peter and Paul, all the saints, and you, brethren, to pray to the Lord our God for me.

Exorcism Prayer of St. Michael

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into Gehenna Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

Prayer before Meals

Bless us, O Lord, and these thy gifts which we are about to receive from thy bounty. Through Christ our Lord. Amen. (Invoke God or the saint(s) of the day, followed by your special patron saint(s).)

N._____, have mercy on us or pray for us. Hail Mary...

Prayer after Meals

We give thee thanks, almighty God, for these gifts which we have received from thy bounty. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

On the words Hell, the Underworld, and Gehenna

Another word for the underworld is hell, which includes 1) the place where the damned reside (also known as Gehenna); 2) the place where the Old Testament Elect resided during the Old Testament era (known as the Limbo of the Fathers or Abraham's Bosom), and 3) the place where the saved go to have their venial sins remitted or to expiate punishment due to their sins called Purgatory. Because the word "hell" is commonly associated with the hell of the damned, I use the word Gehenna when referring to the hell of the damned. And I use the word underworld when it means either all the places in the underworld or one of the two places, Limbo of the Fathers or Purgatory, depending on the context of the other words used. (For more information, RJMI article On the Word "Hell" as Used in Some Bibles.)

For non-members of the Catholic Church

While catechumens are Catholic, they are not members of the Catholic Church.³ Only members of the Catholic Church (also known as the faithful) have God as their Father and Mary as their Mother. Therefore, let those who are non-members of the Catholic Church keep in mind that when you say a prayer that says God is your Father and Mary is your Mother, that God will only be your Father and Mary your Mother when you become a member of the Catholic Church.

The poor souls in purgatory can only be helped by the prayers, alms, penances, and other good works of the faithful. Therefore, let non-members of the Catholic Church keep in mind that while you can pray for the poor souls, it will not help them, but it will gain you grace for your devotion. And the poor souls will be able to pray for you.

The faithful can only pray in communion with the faithful, and catechumens can only pray in communion with catechumens. Hence if catechumens are present when the faithful are praying, the catechumens must remain silent and pray in their hearts.

On prayers for the pope or spiritual ruler

Normally when the Holy See is vacant, prayers for the pope are omitted. But in these end times, when the Holy See has been vacant for an extended period of time, substitute the prayers for the pope with prayers for the spiritual ruler of the Catholic Church, if there be one, if God has risen up one such a ruler. This is what God did during the Old Covenant era when he rose up Abraham, Moses, a judge, or Esdras to rule his Church.

When to strike your breast and bow your head

Strike your breast with your clinched fist one time during responses to short invocations of God. For example, when you say "have mercy on us" or "Jesus deliver us." in the litanies and other prayers: "God the Father of heaven, <u>have mercy on us.</u> God the Son, redeemer of the world, <u>have mercy on us.</u> God the Holy Spirit, <u>have mercy on us.</u> Holy Trinity, one God, <u>have mercy on us.</u>" Or "From all evil, Jesus deliver us." "From all sin, Jesus deliver us."

Strike your breast three times during the Confiteor when you say "Through my fault, through my fault, through my most grevious fault." (Mea culpa, mea culpa, mea maxima culpa.)

Strike your breast three times during the Hail Holy Queen when you says "O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary."

Bow your head when reciting the "Glory Be" prayer

When to kiss the Miraculous Medal

If you are wearing the Miraculous Medal, kiss it every time you say, "O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee.

When someone leads the prayers

If you are praying alone, then pray all the prayers.

When someone is leading the prayers, the part said by the leader is marked with L., and the part said by the followers is marked with R.

For example, when the Our Father, Hail Mary, or Glory Be is listed, the leader prays the first part, and the responders pray the second part.

Our Father: L. Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

R. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and let us not fall into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

Hail Mary: L. Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus. R. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Glory Be: L. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. R. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, forever and ever. Amen.

If there is no L. or R., then all present pray, the leader and the followers.

And the "Let Us Pray" is always said by the leader, and the following prayer is prayed by all (the leaders and followers) unless otherwise noted with a L., which means it is said only by the leader. For example,

The "Let Us Pray" in the following prayer is said by the leader and the rest is said by all:

LET US PRAY: Grant, we beseech thee, O Lord God, that by the glorious intercession of Blessed Mary, ever virgin, we thy servants may enjoy purity of heart, soundness of mind, health of body, and be delivered from present sorrows and enter into that joy which hath no end. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

This following prayer is said only by the leader:

L. Let us pray: O my beloved Savior, at sight of thy most holy face disfigured by suffering, at sight of thy Sacred Heart so full of love, I cry out: "Lord Jesus, imprint on my heart thy sacred wounds so that I may read therein sorrow and love: sorrow, to endure every sorrow for thee; love, to love nothing more than thee.

How to bless yourself

The sign of the cross is made by touching the right or left hand sequentially to the forehead, the middle of the chest, and both shoulders (from left to right for Western Catholics, and from right to left for the Eastern Catholics), accompanied by the Trinitarian formula: at the forehead "In the name of the Father"; at the middle of the chest "and of the Son"; across the shoulders "and of the Holy Spirit." If you only have one hand, then you have to bless with that hand.

The Eastern Catholics touch the right shoulder first and then the left.

When to bless yourself

- 1) You can bless yourself for protection at any time.
- 2) Regarding prayers, bless yourself when you see a "\u24". And bless yourself when you start a single prayer or a continuous set of prayers.

Invocations

In the case of invocations directed to God, the response is "Have mercy on us"; for Mary and the angels and saints, the response is "Pray for us"; for an object (such as the Holy Cross), the response is "Bless us and protect us." The leader says the first part, and the responders pray the second part.

On revisions and additions

Many of the revisions contained in this prayer book were essential since prayers reflect what we believe. Hence I removed parts of prayers that were heretical or were ambiguous and thus easily taken in the heretical sense, and I added parts that profess dogmas that should have been

professed but were purposely omitted. And many new prayers were added. The result is a pure, holy, and clean prayer book resting upon the Rock of Peter, the Rock of the Catholic Church. The following examples show a few out of hundreds of the changes and some of the additions that were made:

Instructions

It is customary to pray the Office standing, but for penance it can be prayed kneeling.

Alleluia is said at all the Hours throughout the year except from Ash Day to Holy Seventh Weekday when it is replaced by Praise be to thee, O Lord, King of eternal glory.

If you pray the Office alone, recite all the prayers yourself.

All prayers without **L.** or **R.** are recited together except for the psalms. The verses in the psalms are separated by a space and should be alternately recited by the leader and responders. The leader begins each psalm and always leads the Glory Be.

Whenever there is a 4, bless yourself. For the "Opening Prayer" for the Offices, make the cross over your lips with your right thumb. For the prayer "Convert us, O God..." during Compline, make the cross over your heart with your right thumb.

Whenever the Apostles' Creed, Our Father, Hail Mary, or Glory Be is said, the leader recites the first part and the responders recite the second part.

WHOSOEVER willeth to be saved needs above all to hold the Catholic faith. Which faith except every one do keep whole and undefiled, he will without doubt perish everlastingly. Now the Catholic faith is this, that we worship one God in Trinity and Trinity in unity, neither confounding the Persons nor dividing the substance. For there is one Person of the Father, another of the Son, and another of the Holy Spirit. But the divine nature of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit is one, their glory equal, their majesty coeternal. Such as the Father is, such is the Son, and such is the Holy Spirit; the Father uncreated, the Son uncreated, and the Holy Spirit uncreated; the Father infinite, the Son infinite, and the Holy Spirit infinite; the Father eternal, the Son eternal,

and the Holy Spirit eternal. And yet they are not three eternals but one eternal. As also they are not three uncreated nor three infinites but one uncreated and one infinite. So likewise the Father is almighty, the Son almighty, and the Holy Spirit almighty. And yet they are not three almighties but one almighty. So the Father is God, the Son is God, and the Holy Spirit is God. And yet they are not three Gods but one God. So the Father is Lord, the Son is Lord, and the Holy Spirit is Lord. And yet they are not three Lords but one Lord. For as we are compelled by Christian truth to acknowledge every Person by himself to be God and Lord, so are we forbidden by the Catholic religion to say there be three Gods or three Lords. The Father is made of none. neither created nor begotten. The Son is of the Father alone, not made nor created but eternally begotten. The Holy Spirit is of the Father and the Son, not made nor created nor begotten but eternally proceeding. So there is one Father, not three Fathers; one Son, not three Sons; one Holy Spirit, not three Holy Spirits. And in this Trinity is nothing before or after, nothing is greater or less. But all three Persons are co-eternal and co-equal with one another. So that in all things, as is aforesaid, the unity in Trinity and the Trinity in unity is to be worshipped. He therefore that willeth to be saved, let him think thus of the Trinity.

But it is necessary for everlasting salvation that he also believe faithfully the Incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ. The right faith therefore is that we believe and confess that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is God and man. He is God eternally begotten of the substance of the Father, and he is man born of the substance of his mother in time. Perfect God, perfect man, consisting of a rational soul and a human body; equal to the Father according to his Godhead, inferior to the Father according to his humanity. Who although he be God and man, yet he is not two but one Christ; one, however, not by conversion of the divinity into flesh but by taking of the manhood into God; one altogether, not by confusion of substance but by unity of Person. For as the rational

soul and body are one man, so God and man are one Christ, who suffered for our salvation, descended into the underworld, rose the third day from the dead, and ascended into heaven. He sitteth at the right hand of the Father, God almighty, from whence he shall come to judge the living and the dead. At his coming all men shall rise with their bodies and shall give account for their own works. And they that have done good shall go into life everlasting; but they that have done evil, into everlasting fire. This is the Catholic faith, which except a man believe faithfully and firmly he cannot be saved.

This Office is said in the evening of Maundy Day.

General Instructions: On this and the two following nights, Matins and Lauds are said together. These three services are commonly called the Three Nights of Darkness. During Tenebrae, six candles are lighted on the altar and fifteen candles are lighted in a triangle-shaped candlestick called the Tenebrae Hearse (with seven candles on each side and one at the top). The Tenebrae Hearse is placed at the Epistle side of the altar. During the service, as the antiphon is repeated a second time after each psalm, the hearse candles are gradually extinguished, one at a time beginning with the lowest candle on the left and alternating either side of the candlestick in ascending order. Only the highest candle of the hearse is left burning after the psalms have all been said.

Lesson IV

(The Treatise on the Psalms, by St. Augustine the Bishop: Psalm 54)

"Hear my prayer, O God, and hide not thyself from my petition. Take heed unto me and hear me, how I mourn in my trial and am vexed because of the crying of the enemy and of the tribulation which cometh from the ungodly." These are the words of one who is disquieted, beset by trouble and anxiety. He prayeth as one under much suffering, desiring

- deliverance from evil. Let us see from what evil he doth suffer: and as we hear what that evil is, let us recognize that we also suffer from the same thing so that as we share his tribulation we may also join in his prayer. I mourn in my trial (saith he) and am vexed. When doth he mourn? When is he vexed? In my trial, saith he. He hath in mind the ungodly that cause him tribulation, which same he calleth his trial. Therefore, think not that the wicked can serve no good purpose in this world and that God is unable to accomplish good by means of them. Every wicked person is permitted to live in order that he may be made righteous, or else that the righteous may be tried by him.

Lesson V

I would to God that the ungodly who now try us were converted and so were on trial with us. Yet, though they continue to try us, let us not hate them, for we know not whether any of them will continue to the end in his evil ways. And mostly, when thou thinkest thyself to be hating thine enemy, thou hatest one that may become thy brother and thou knowest it not. The devil and his angels are shewn to us in Scripture as doomed to everlasting fire; their amendment is hopeless, against whom we wage a hidden strife. For which strife the Apostle would arm us, saying: We wrestle not against flesh and blood (that is, not against men, whom we see) but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world. Mark that he saith not: The rulers of this world, lest perchance thou shouldst think that

- devils are rulers of heaven and earth; but rather he saith: The rulers of the darkness of this world. When he speaketh thus of the world, he would have us understand the lovers of the world whereof the Gospel saith: And the world knew him not.

The wood of the cross seemed a worthy object of scorn to his enemies; and standing before that very wood, they wagged their heads, saying: If thou be the Son of God, come down from the cross! Thus did he stretch forth his hands to a disobedient and gainsaying people. If he is just who doth live by faith, then is he unrighteous who hath not faith? Wherefore when he saith "unrighteousness," understand that it is the disobedience of unbelief. The Lord then saw unrighteousness and strife in the city and stretched out his hands unto an unbelieving and gainsaying people. And yet, looking upon the very same, he saith: Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do.

Lesson IV

(The Treatise on the Psalms, by St. Augustine the Bishop: Psalm 63)

"Thou has protected me, O God, from the assembly of the malignant, from the multitude of the workers of iniquity." Now let us behold our head himself. Many martyrs have suffered such torments, but nothing is so conspicuous as the head of martyrs. There we see better what they endured. He was protected from the multitude of the malignant; that is, God protected himself, the Son, and the Man assumed by the Son protected his own flesh. For he is the Son of Man and the Son of God: the Son of God because of the form of God; the Son of Man because of the form of a servant, having it in his power to lay down his life and take it up again. What could his enemies do against him? They killed his body but they did not kill his soul. Take notice. then. It signified little for our Lord to exhort the martyrs by word if he had not fortified them by his example.

L. Ye are come out to take me as a thief, with swords and clubs. I was daily with you in the temple teaching and ye did not apprehend me. And lo! Ye scourge me and lead me to be crucified.

R. And when they had laid hands on Jesus and taken him, he said to them: I was daily with you in the temple teaching and ye did not apprehend me. And lo! Ye scourge me and lead me to be crucified.

Lesson V

You know what was the assembly of the wicked Jews and what the multitude of those that work iniquity. But what was that iniquity? It was that they intended to kill our Lord Jesus Christ. "I have done," saith he, "so many good works among you. For which of them will you kill me?" He bore with all their weaknesses, he cured all their sick, he preached the kingdom of heaven, he concealed not their crimes that they might rather hate them than the physician that healed them. Yet such was their ingratitude for all these cures, that like men raving in a high fever they raged against the physician who came to cure them, and formed a design of destroying him, as if they had a mind to try whether he was a real man that could die or some thing above men and would not die. We find their words in the Book of Wisdom: "Let us condemn him," say they, "to a most shameful death. Let us examine him, for regard will be had to his words. If he be truly the Son of God, let him deliver him."

- L. Darkness covered the earth whilst the Jews crucified Jesus. And about the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice: My God! Why hast thou forsaken me? And bowing down his head, he gave up the spirit.

Lesson VI

"They sharpened their tongues like a sword." Let not the Jews say "We did not kill Christ," under pretence, for they delivered him up to Pilate, the judge, that they might seem innocent of his death. Thus when Pilate had said to them "Put him to death yourselves," they answered "It is not lawful for us to put any man to death." Hereby they pretended to throw the injustice of their crime

upon the judge who was a man, but could they deceive a judge who is God? What Pilate did made him partaker of their crime, but in comparison with them he was much more innocent. For he labored what he could to get him out of their hands and for that reason ordered him to be scourged and shown to them. This he did to our Lord, not by way of persecution but to satisfy their rage, that the sight of him in that condition might move them to pity and make them desist from desiring his death. All this he did. But when they still persisted, you know that he had no hand in it, that he was innocent of his death. And yet he really put him to death. But if he was guilty for doing so against his will, are they innocent who forced him to do it? By no means. He pronounced sentence upon him and commanded him to be crucified and so might be said to kill him. But you, O Jews, you also have killed him. How? With the sword of your tongues, for ye sharpened your tongues, when you cried out "Crucify him, crucify him!"

And being consummated, he became to all that obey him the cause of everlasting salvation, called by God a high priest according to the order of Melchisedech.

Lesson IV

(The Treatise on the Psalms, by St. Augustine, Bishop of Hippo: Psalm 63)

- "Man shall come to a deep heart, and God shall be exalted. They said: Who will see us? They failed in making diligent search for wicked designs." Christ, as man, came to those designs and suffered himself to be seized on as a man. For he could not be seized on if he were not man, nor seen if he were not man, nor scourged if he were not man, nor crucified nor die if he were not man. As man, therefore, he came to all these sufferings which could have no effect on him if he were not man. But if he had not been man, man could not have been redeemed. Man came to the deep heart; that is, the secret heart, exposing his humanity to human view but hiding his divinity, concealing the form of God by which he is equal to the Father and offering the form of the servant by which he is inferior to the Father.
- L. Our shepherd, the fountain of living water, is gone, at whose departure the sun was darkened. For the devil is taken who made the first man a prisoner. Our Saviour broke the gates and blots of death.
- **R.** He, indeed, have freed prisoners from the underworld and overthrew the powers of the devil, for the devil is taken who made the first man a prisoner. Today our Saviour broke the gates and blots of death.

Lesson V

How far did they carry this their diligent search, in which they failed so much, that when our Lord was dead and buried they placed guards at the sepulchre? Dost thou produce sleeping witnesses? Certainly thou thyself sleepest who failest in making search after such things.

St. Andrew Advent Prayer

Said daily beginning on St. Andrew's Feast Day through the Vigil of Christmas.

Hail and blessed be the hour and the moment in which the Son of God was born of the most pure Blessed Virgin Mary at midnight in Bethlehem in the piercing cold. In that hour vouchsafe, O my God, to hear my prayer and grant my petitions. Through the merits of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Blessing of the Advent Wreath

The blessing is only done once on the First Lord's Day in Advent before the lighting of the first candle.

- L. Our help is in the name of the Lord.
- **R.** Who made heaven and earth.

LET US PRAY: O God, by whose word things are sanctified, pour forth thy blessing upon this wreath, and grant that we who use it may prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ and may receive from thee abundant graces. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Sprinkle the wreath with holy water.

The Lighting of the Advent Wreath

Before your main meal of the day, light the candle[s] on the Advent Wreath, per the following instructions, and say Daily Advent Antiphons for the appropriate week. After your meal, blow out the candle[s].

The Advent wreath is lit in sequence, with the lighting of each new candle bringing you closer to Christmas:

- 1) You light the first candle, which is purple, on the First Lord's Day in Advent and every day that week.
- 2) The second week, you light the first two purple candles on the Second Lord's Day in Advent and do the same every day that week.
- 3) On the Third Lord's Day in Advent, you light the first two purple candles plus the rose "joy" candle, and you light those same three candles every day that week.
- 4) On the Fourth Lord's Day in Advent, you light the first two purple candles, the rose candle, and the final purple candle (four candles total), and you light all four candles every day that week.
- 5) On Christmas Day, you light all of those candles plus the Christ candle, if your wreath has one.

Daily Advent Antiphons

Said daily beginning the 1st Lord's Day of Advent through the Vigil of Christmas. Begin with "Daily Prayer" and then recite the prayer for the appropriate week.

Daily Prayer

Drop down dew from above, ye heavens, and let the clouds rain the Just One. Let the earth be opened and bud forth the Savior.

First Week

Rejoice, O daughter of Sion, and be jubilantly glad, O daughter of Israel. Behold, thy Lord comes and in his day a great light shall arise. The mountains shall drop down sweetness and the hills shall flow with milk and honey, for the Great Prophet shall come and he shall renew Jerusalem.

Antiphon: All. Come, let us adore our Lord and King who is about to come to us!

Behold, thy God comes, the Man of the house of David, to sit upon the throne. And you shall see and your heart shall rejoice.

Antiphon

Second Week

Behold, the Lord our protector comes, the Holy One of Israel, having on his head the regal crown. And he shall rule from sea to sea and from the river to the ends of the earth.

Antiphon

Behold, the Lord comes and he will not lie. Should he tarry, await him, for he shall assuredly come and shall not delay.

Antiphon

Third Week

The Lord shall come down as rain upon the fleece, and in his days shall justice spring up and abundance of peace. And all kings of the earth shall adore him, all nations shall serve him.

Antiphon

A Child is born to us, and a Son is given to us, and the government is upon his shoulder. And his name shall be called Wonderful, Counselor, God the Mighty, the Father of the World to Come, the Prince of Peace.

Antiphon

Fourth Week

And thou, Bethlehem Ephrata, art a little one among the thousands of Juda. Out of thee shall he come forth unto me that is to be the ruler in Israel. And his going forth is from the beginning from the days of eternity.

Antiphon

Our forerunner, Jesus, the Lamb undefiled, has entered the Holy of holies for us, having become a high priest forever according to the order of Melchisedech. He is the King of justice, having neither beginning of days nor end of life.

Antiphon

From 12/17 to 12/23

Said daily during Vespers, beginning the 17th day of the 12th month. If you do not pray Vespers, then pray the antiphons with the prayer before your meal.

O Come, O Come, Emmanuel

Sing this

1) O come, O come, Emmanuel, / And ransom captive Israel, / That mourns in lonely exile here / Until the Son of God appear. Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel / Shall come to thee, O Israel.

The "O" Antiphons

12/17: O Wisdom, who didst come out of the mouth of the most High, reaching from end to end and ordering all things mightily and sweetly: Come and teach us the way of prudence.

12/18: O Adonai and leader of the house of Israel, who didst appear to Moses in the flame of the burning bush and didst give unto him the law on Sinai: Come and with an outstretched arm redeem us.

12/19: O Root of Jesse, who dost stand for an ensign of the people, before whom kings shall keep silence and unto whom the Gentiles shall make their supplication: Come to deliver us, and tarry not.

Advent Resolutions Prayer

This prayer can be said on the Lord's Day each week during Advent.

O Infant Savior, the prophets of old longed for thy coming into their world, we long for thy return to our modern world—another coming of thyself and thy laws into our pagan times. Only then will we breathe in a Christian atmosphere in which joy replaces sorrow, in which love casts out darkness.

O Mary, our mother, be our model during this holy season. Christ was alive within thee during the first Advent; we want him to be alive within us more than ever during this Advent. May we not merely possess our precious Catholic faith—rather, may it take complete possession of us so that wherever we go, whatever we do or say, it will be the Christ Child that inspires us.

We resolve to make our Christmas a holy day with Christ instead of a holiday without him. We resolve to observe Christmas as the birthday of Christ and not as a day to give and receive presents. And we resolve to help, if possible, at least one worthy poor family in honor of the Holy Family of Bethlehem. Finally, we promise every day to give glory to God in the highest and to work and pray for peace on earth among men of good will. Amen.

On the Manger Scene and other Advent and Christmas decorations

On Christmas Decorations: Put up the Manger Scene and Christmas lights about two weeks before Christmas. But do not put in the Wise Men until the eve of Epiphany Day. And do not put up the indoor Christmas items until Christmas Eve, preferable after sundown. The Manger Scene, along with other Christmas decorations, should be taken down on 1/14.

When recited as a group: The leader announces all titles and leads the prayers written in italics; the leader (L), responders (R), and whole group (All) read their parts as designated. Stand for each Station unless otherwise noted. But kneel for the Our Father, Hail Mary, Glory Be, and following invocation. Stand to sing the Stabat Mater verse that completes each Station, and sing it while proceeding to the next Station. Genuflect at "Because by thy holy cross thou hast redeemed the world."

L. Let each one, kneeling before the high altar, make an Act of Contrition and then say,

Preparatory Prayer

All. O most merciful Jesus, with a contrite heart and penitent spirit I bow down in profound humility before thy divine majesty. I adore thee as my supreme Lord and Master; I believe in thee, I hope in thee, I love thee above all things. I am heartily sorry for having offended thee, my supreme and greatest good. I resolve to amend my life; and I hope to obtain thy mercy. The sight of thy holy cross on which thou didst die inspires me with hope and consolation. I will, therefore, meditate on thy sufferings and visit the Stations of thy Passion in company with thy sorrowful Mother and my guardian angel with the intention of promoting thy honor and saving my soul.

First Station

Jesus Is Condemned to Death



- **L.** We adore thee, O Christ, and we praise thee.
- **R.** Because by thy holy cross thou hast redeemed the world.
- L. Jesus, most innocent, who never committed sin, was condemned to death, and moreover to the most ignominious death of the cross. To avoid insurrection, Pilate delivered Jesus into the hands of the Jews. A fearful crime—to condemn Innocence to death for the sake of temporal peace!
- R. O innocent Jesus! I, having sinned, am guilty of everlasting death; but thou willingly dost accept the unjust sentence of death so that I might live. For whom, then, shall I henceforth live if not for thee, my Lord? If I loved men more than thee, I could not be thy servant. Let me, therefore, rather displease men and all the world than displease thee, O Jesus.

Thy yoke is sweet and thy burden is light; I willingly accept it. I will take up my cross and follow thee even in hard and difficult times.



- R. O Jesus! Whosoever does not take up his cross and follow thee is not worthy of thee. Behold, I join thee in the way of thy cross; I will be thy assistant, following thy bloody footsteps, that I may come to thee to life everlasting.

- R. Most merciful Jesus! What return shall I make for all the benefits thou hast bestowed upon me? Behold, I consecrate myself entirely to thy service. I offer and consecrate to thee my heart; imprint on it thy sacred image, never again to be effaced by sin.

From this very moment I will earnestly strive to reform; nevermore will I sin! Thou, O support of the weak, by thy grace, without which I can do nothing good, strengthen me to carry out faithfully this my resolution.

Weep thou also, for there is nothing more pleasing to our Lord and nothing more profitable for thyself than tears shed from contrition for thy sins.
- R. O Jesus, who shall give to my eyes a torrent of tears that I may weep for my sins? I beseech thee, through thy bitter and bloody tears, to move my heart by thy divine grace so that from my eyes tears may flow abundantly and that I may weep over thy sufferings, and still more over their cause, my sins.

- R. Most merciful Jesus, I return thee thanks for giving me the grace and help to not continue in sin and to not fall, as I have so often deserved, into the depths of Gehenna. Kindle in me an earnest desire of amendment. Let me never again relapse, but vouchsafe me the grace to persevere in holiness.

Jesus was despoiled of his garments. How happy will I also die after laying aside my former self with all evil desires and sinful inclinations!
- R. Help me, O Jesus, to be the new man you want me to be if I am not. Help me to be renewed according to thy will and desire. I will not spare myself, however painful this should be for me. Help me to conform my will when it conflicts with thine. I desire to die in order to live for thee forever.

Help me not to be fretful, impatient, and full of complaints!
- R. O Jesus, gracious Lamb of God, I renounce forever my impatience. Crucify, O Lord, my flesh and its concupiscences; scourge, scathe, and punish me in this world, but spare me in the next. I commit myself to thee, resigning myself to thy holy will. May it be done in all things!

- L. Behold Jesus crucified! Behold his wounds received for love of you! His whole appearance betokens love: his head is bent to kiss you, his arms are extended to embrace you, his heart is open to receive you. O superabundance of love, Jesus, the Son of God, dies upon the cross so that man may live and be delivered from everlasting death!
- R. O most amiable Jesus! Who will grant me that I may die for thee! I will at least endeavor to die to the world. How must I regard the world and its vanities when I behold thee hanging on the cross, covered with wounds? O Jesus, receive me into thy wounded heart. I belong entirely to thee; for thee do I ultimately desire to live and die.

Thirteenth Station

- **R.** Because by thy holy cross thou hast redeemed the world.
- L. Jesus did not descend from the cross but remained on it until he died. And when taken down from it, he, in death as in life, rested on the bosom of his Mother.

 Persevere in your resolutions of reform, and do not part from the cross; he who persevereth to the end shall be saved. Consider, moreover, how pure the heart should be that receives the body and blood of Christ in the adorable Sacrament of the Altar.
- R. O Lord Jesus, thy lifeless body, mangled and lacerated, found a worthy resting place on the bosom of thy Virgin Mother. If I have unworthily received thee in Holy Communion while in mortal sin, please forgive me. Create in me a new heart, that I may worthily receive thy most sacred body and blood in Holy Communion and that thou mayest remain in me and I in thee forever.

- L. The body of Jesus is interred in a sepulchre not his own. He would not even have a grave of his own because he was not of this world. You, who are so attached to the evil things of the world, henceforth despise them that you may not perish with them.
- R. O Jesus, thou hast set me apart from the world; what, then, shall I seek therein? Thou hast created me for heaven; what, then, have I to do with this evil world? Depart from me, deceitful world, with thy vanities! Henceforth I will follow the way of the cross traced out for me by my Redeemer and journey onward to my heavenly home, there to dwell forever and ever.

Amen.

All (sing): Virgin of all virgins blest! / Listen to my fond request: / Let me share the grief of thine;

Be to me, O Virgin, nigh, / Lest in flames I burn and die / In that awful Judgment Day.



How to Pray the Rosary

Begin the Rosary by making the Sign of the Cross with the rosary crucifix.

The Sign of the Cross

★ In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Amen.

While holding the crucifix, pray the following Introductory Prayer and the Apostles' Creed:

Introductory Prayer

All. I unite with all the angels and saints in heaven. I unite with thee, O my Jesus, in order to praise worthily thy holy Mother and to praise thee in her and through her. I renounce all the distractions that I may have during this Rosary, which I wish to pray with modesty, attention, and devotion.

I offer thee, O most holy Trinity, this creed in honor of all the mysteries of our Faith, this Our Father and these three Hail Mary's in honor of the unity of thy essence and the trinity of thy Persons. I ask of thee a lively faith, a firm hope, and an ardent charity. Amen.

The Apostles' Creed

- L. I believe in God the Father almighty and in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into the underworld; the third day he rose from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and sitteth at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from thence he shall come to judge the living and the dead.
- R. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the remission of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

On the single bead that follows the crucifix, pray the Our Father:

The Our Father

L. Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom

come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

R. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and let us not fall into temptation, but deliver us from evil. Amen.

On each of the next three beads, pray a Hail Mary with the petition for an increase of faith, hope, and charity:

The Hail Mary

- L. Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with thee; blessed art thou among women, and blessed is the fruit of thy womb, Jesus.
- R. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

On the single bead next to the medal, pray the Glory Be:

The Glory Be

- L. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.
- R. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, forever and ever. Amen.

Choose one of the sets of Mysteries (Joyful, Sorrowful, or Glorious), and holding the medal announce the title of the First Mystery. (For the titles of the Mysteries, refer to The Rosary Mysteries, p. 86.) For example, "The First Joyful Mystery: the Annunciation." While holding the medal read the accompanying prayer ("We offer thee, O Lord Jesus...") and then pray the Our Father.

On each of the following ten beads, pray a Hail Mary while meditating on the First Mystery. On the single bead that follows, pray the Glory Be and the petition prayer for the Mystery ("May the grace of the Mystery of the..."). This completes the first decade. On that same bead, announce the Second Mystery, read its accompanying prayer and then pray the Our Father. On each of the ten beads that follow, pray a Hail Mary while meditating on the Second Mystery. Pray the Glory Be and the petition prayer for the Mystery on the single bead, thus ending the second decade. Continue in this way for the

third, fourth, and fifth decades, ending the fifth decade on the medal. On the medal pray the last Glory Be, the petition, and finish with Ending Prayers for the Rosary, p. 89.

To continue with another chaplet (a set of five Mysteries) or the full 15-decade Rosary, do not pray the ending prayers for the Rosary at this point but simply announce the next Mystery on the medal and continue the prayers around the rosary as before, ending on the medal. Holding the medal, complete the Rosary with the Ending Prayers for the Rosary, p. 89.

3. The Nativity



L. We offer thee, O Lord Jesus, this third decade in honor of thy nativity in the stable at Bethlehem; and we ask of thee, through this Mystery and through the intercession of thy holy Mother, detachment from the evil things of the world, non-idolization of

riches, and the spirit of poverty. Amen.

Short Form of the Rosary

To pray the short form of the Rosary, refer to the diagram and the following prayers found in <u>How to</u> Pray the Rosary, p. 86.

Begin by making the Sign of the Cross with the rosary crucifix. Holding the crucifix, pray the Apostles' Creed. On the single bead next to the crucifix, pray the Our Father. On each of the following three beads, pray a Hail Mary with the petition for an increase in faith, hope, and charity; and on the single bead next to the medal, pray the Glory Be.

Choose one of the sets of Mysteries (Joyful, Sorrowful, or Glorious). Holding the medal, begin the first decade by announcing the title of the First Mystery. (For the titles of the Mysteries, refer to The Rosary Mysteries, p. 86.) For example, "The First Joyful Mystery: the

Annunciation." On the same medal pray the Our Father. On each of the ten beads that follow, pray a Hail Mary while meditating on the First Mystery; and on the single bead that follows, pray the Glory Be. This completes the first decade. On that same bead, announce the Second Mystery and pray the Our Father. On each of the ten beads that follow, pray a Hail Mary while meditating on the Second Mystery. Pray the Glory Be on the single bead, thus completing the second decade.

Continue in this way for the third, fourth, and fifth decade, ending the fifth decade on the medal. Holding the medal, pray the Hail Holy Queen, p. 89, then the Exorcism Prayer of St. Michael, p. 18, and then make the Sign of the Cross.

And we sincerely promise to make recompense, as far as we can with the help of thy grace, for all the neglect of thy great love and for the sins we and others have committed in the past. * Henceforth we will live a life of unwavering faith, of purity of conduct, of perfect observance of the precepts of the gospel. * We promise to the best of our power to prevent others from offending thee and to teach the Catholic faith to all who sincerely ask about it. *

O loving Jesus, through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, our model in reparation, deign to receive the voluntary offering we make of this act of expiation; * and by the crowning gift of perseverance, keep us faithful unto death in our duty and the allegiance we owe to thee so that we may all one day come to that happy home where thou with the Father and the Holy Spirit livest and reignest, God, forever and ever. Amen.

L. Holy wound of the right foot of my Jesus, I adore thee! I compassionate thee, O my Jesus, for that most bitter pain which thou didst suffer. * I thank thee for the love which pierced thee with such torture and shedding of blood in order to remit my sins. * I offer to the Eternal Father all the pain and love of thy most sacred humanity; * and I pray

unto him for grace to weep over my transgressions with burning tears and to enable me to persevere in the good which I have begun, without ever swerving again from my obedience to the commandments of my God.

To the Wound of the Left Hand

L. Holy wound of the left hand of my Jesus, I adore thee! Sweet heart of my Jesus, * grant that I may ever love thee more and more.

Prayer for an Increase of Holy Communions

L. O sweet Jesus, who came into the world to remit our sins by sanctifying grace, and who to preserve and sustain us didst will to be the remedy of our daily infirmities and to be our food, humbly we pray thee, by thy heart all on fire for love of us, pour out thy Holy Spirit upon those who are unhappily in deadly sin so that they may be converted to thee. confess their sins, receive the life of sanctifying grace, and receive thee in Holy Communion along with all others who are in the state of grace. * May they approach devoutly to thy holy altar, whereby receiving thee in Holy Communion they may obtain the remission of their venial sins and punishment due to their sins, the nourishing of the life of grace in their hearts, the purifying more and more of their souls, and at last the attainment of everlasting life. Realizing that my visit to thee is of little avail unless I try to live a better life and set a better example, I am resolved to go forth again to my duties and my concerns with a renewed spirit of perseverance and good will. * In my daily life I will try to love and serve God well and love my neighbor also, for these two things go together. * I will try to be a true disciple, indeed; help me, O Jesus, in this my resolution. *

Bless me, dear Lord, before I go; and bless all the faithful and catechumens who are here and those who could not come, especially the sick and the dying. * Bless our homes and our Catholic children, and bless our life and the hour of our death. * Grant the grace of conversion to our non-Catholic family members and friends and to other non-Catholics. *

Grant rest to the souls of the faithful departed, and bring them into the light of thy divine glory. * May we who have worshipped thee and been blessed by thee here on earth come to behold the radiant glory of thy unveiled countenance in heaven, forever and ever. Amen.

Say three times:

Most Sacred Heart of Jesus,* thy kingdom come!

For the Intentions of the Holy Father

If there is a pope, pray the following prayers: I offer this Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be for the intentions of Pope N...

If there is no pope, pray the following prayers: I offer this Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be for a future pope and the papacy (and if there is a spiritual ruler) and for the intentions of our spiritual ruler N. ...

CONFESSION

Prayers before Examination of Conscience

An in depth examination of conscience, as this one is, is only necessary once a year, the best time being in Lent. Your daily examination at night applies to sins you may have committed during the day and thus should be brief.

Reflect that this confession may be the last of your life; therefore prepare yourself for it as if you were lying sick upon your deathbed and already at the brink of the grave. Ask God to give you the grace to make a good examination of conscience, the light to see your sins clearly, and the strength to make a sincere confession and to amend your life. If you do not have true sorrow for your sins and a firm purpose of amendment, then your confessed sins will not be remitted even if the priest gives you absolution. For the sake of brevity, this book contains a brief but good examination of conscience.

Prayer to Jesus

O my Lord Jesus Christ, Judge of the living and the dead, before whom I must appear one day to give an exact account of my whole life, enlighten me, I beseech thee, and give me a humble and contrite heart so that I may see wherein I have offended thine infinite majesty and may judge myself now with such a just severity that thou mayest judge me then with mercy and clemency.

Invocation of the Holy Spirit

O Holy Spirit, Source of all light, Spirit of wisdom, of understanding, and of knowledge, come to my assistance and enable me to make a good confession.

Enlighten me and help me now to know my sins, as one day I shall be forced to recognize them before thy judgment seat. Bring to my mind the evil which I have done and the good which I have neglected. Permit me not to be blinded by self-love. Grant me, moreover, thy grace for a sincere

confession, a heartfelt sorrow for my sins and a firm purpose of amendment so that I may be forgiven and admitted into thy friendship. Amen.

Examination of Conscience

Preliminary Examination

There are two kinds of sins that we commit ourselves: mortal sins and venial sins. Mortal sins are major offences against God and thus are deadly sins. The guilt of only one mortal sin places a Catholic who was in a state of grace and thus on the road to heaven in a state of damnation and thus on the road to Gehenna. Venial sins are minor offences against God which hence are not deadly sins but if not confessed can lead to mortal sins. Faults are the least offences against God but if not confessed can lead to venial sins.

When did you make your last confession? Did you have sufficient sorrow to awaken contrition?

Did you omit to confess a mortal sin either intentionally or through forgetfulness?

Did you intentionally neglect to do the penance imposed on you, or were you so careless as to forget it?

Have you carried out the promise of amendment and the good resolutions you made at your last confession, or have you paid no heed to them?

Examine your conscience in regard to the Ten Commandments, the deadly sins, the nine ways of being accessory to another's sin, the spiritual and corporal works of mercy, and the six precepts of the Church.

The Ten Commandments

First: I am the Lord thy God... Thou shalt not have strange gods before me... Thou shalt not adore them nor serve them.

Have you denied or doubted matters of faith (dogmas)? Have you denied the faith by sins of omission by not professing the faith when obliged to, or not condemning heresy or idolatry when obliged to, or not denouncing or punishing heretics or idolaters when obliged to?⁶

Have you murmured against God because of adversity or the prosperity of others? Have you despaired or presumed of God's mercy?

Have you believed in fortune-tellers or consulted them? Have you believed in or read the messages in fortune cookies? Have you had your palm read? Have you believed in, read, or used horoscopes or any other form of astrology? Have you used a Ouija board or Tarot cards? Have you believed in or practiced Santería, Voodoo, Brujería, the Kabala, or any other form of witchcraft? Have you made use of any superstitious practices?

Have you sinned against the faith by performing an act of religious communion with heretics, schismatics, idolaters, or other men who do not adhere to the Catholic Church?

Have you sinned by being in religious communion with pre-catechumens, catechumens, or unbelievers?

Have you neglected your daily prayers or omitted religious duties or practices through motives of sloth, laziness, or human respect? Have you neglected to study the Catholic faith? Have you neglected to perform acts of exterior and interior mortification when required? Have you fasted or done other voluntary penances when you were not supposed to (such as on non-penitential days)?

Have you read, viewed, or listened to forbidden items without permission?⁸ Have you spoken with irreverence of the Catholic Church, Catholic faith, Catholic clerics, Catholic religious, or

sacred objects? However, it is not irreverence but your duty to denounce a superior and thus a priest, bishop, and even a pope when his sins merit it.

Second: Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain, for the Lord will not hold him guiltless that shall take the name of the Lord his God in vain.

Have you blasphemed? Have you taken the name of God in vain? Profaned anything relating to the Catholic religion? Have you sworn falsely, rashly, or in slight and trivial matters? Have you cursed yourself or unjustly cursed others or any creature? Have you provoked others so as to make them curse or blaspheme God?

Third: Remember thou keep holy the Lord's Day.

Have you kept holy the Lord's Day and all other days commanded to be kept holy? Have you bought or sold things not of necessity on that day? For exceptions see RJMI article, The Law of No Unnecessary Word on the Lord's Day. Done or commanded some unnecessary servile work? (Some Catholics, such as policemen, firemen, doctors and nurses, can work at their jobs on the Lord's Day.) Have you missed Mass through your own fault? Have you been willfully distracted at Mass or distracted others?

Fourth: *Honor thy father and thy mother.*

Have you honored and obeyed your parents, superiors, and masters according to your just duty? Have you lied to them? Have you disobeyed them when obedience was due? However, you must not obey your parents or any other superior when they command you to do or believe something sinful. Have you failed in due reverence to aged persons?

Fifth: Thou shalt not murder.

Have you unjustly procured, desired, or hastened the death of anyone?

Have you hated anyone other than devils and damned humans (whom you must hate)? While you must love all men while they live, you do not have to like all men. You must not like obstinate sinners and must abhor them and even punish or kill them if justice demands it and if possible. 10

Have you unjustly oppressed anyone? Unjustly desired revenge? Not forgiven injuries? Unjustly refused to speak to others? Unjustly used provoking language? Unjustly injured others? Have you given scandal?

Sixth and Ninth: Thou shalt not commit adultery. Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's wife.

Have you dressed immodestly?¹¹
Been in lewd company? Read impure books? Have you indulged in any impure thoughts, looked at any impure pictures or objects, willfully listened to any impure conversations, told or listened to impure or immodest jokes or stories or music, or in general spoken of impure things? Have you done any impure things or desired to do any while alone or with others?

Have you committed or desired sexual acts with any person or thing other than your spouse if you have one (such as fornication, adultery, homosexuality, bestiality, or masturbation, all of which are mortal sins)? The only lawful and thus nonsinful sexual acts and desires are those between a husband and his wife. However, some sexual acts and desires between a husband and his wife are sinful. 12 Hence have you committed or desired a forbidden and thus sinful sexual act with your spouse? Sexual acts and desires between a husband and his wife are lawful and thus good if they are done or desired for the right reason, in the right way, at the right time, and in the right place. Outside of any of these parameters, the sexual act between spouses is sinful. However, any sexual act or desire while dreaming when you sleep is not sinful.

Have you tried to prevent pregnancy before, during, or after the sexual act? If so, this is the mortal sin of contraception.

(For detailed information, see RJMI book <u>When Sexual Pleasure Is Good</u>; and RJMI book <u>Natural Family</u> <u>Planning to Prevent Conception is Contraception.</u>)

Have you willingly and without a lawful reason looked upon the extreme immodesty of yourself or others? If so, you committed a mortal sin of immodesty even if you were not motivated by any sexual desire.

Have you coveted your neighbor's gender by trying or desiring to change from male to female or female to male (known as Transgenderism), which is not only a mortal sin of immorality but also of heresy?

Seventh and Tenth: Thou shalt not steal. Thou shalt not covet thy neighbor's goods.

Have you stolen anything, or helped or advised others to steal? Have you received anything or part of anything that you knew to be stolen? Do you owe money and not pay it when you can? Have you paid your tithes to the Church? Have you paid your taxes to the State? Have you bought anything with the intention of never paying for it or at least knowing you never could pay for it? Have you made restitution when told to do so by your confessor, or have you put it off from time to time? Have you failed to give back what you borrowed? Have you found anything and not tried to discover its owner, or have you kept it in your possession after you knew to whom it belonged? Have you cheated in business or at games? Have you unjustly damaged another man's goods, or negligently spoiled them? Have you, without good reason, violated copyright laws? One good reason is a wartime situation when things you need for enlightenment, edification, sustenance, and entertainment are withheld or made difficult to possess and hold on to. Have you coveted anything that belongs to another?

Have you been negligent in your work and chores? Did you do your best when working and doing chores?

Or were your chores or work careless, incomplete, or faulty? Did you complain or murmur when asked to help others or when doing your work or chores? Or worse, did you not help a brother who was truly in need when it was in your power to help him?

Did you hold back just wages or money set aside for the poor?

Eighth: Thou shalt not bear false witness against thy neighbor.

Have you lied or unjustly injured anyone by your talk?¹³ Have you judged rashly? Did you commit a sin of calumny by denouncing someone for sin or of being suspect of sin while not having sufficient evidence or, even worse, while knowing they were not guilty or suspect?

Did you commit the sin of detraction by unnecessarily revealing a person's sin to others? Have you flattered others?

Have you broken or not kept a just vow or just promise?

The Six Precepts of the Church

- 1. To hear Mass on the Lord's Day and other Holy Days of Obligation. 14
- 2. To fast and abstain on the days appointed. For exceptions, see RJMI article <u>Things Catholics Must Believe</u> and <u>Do</u>: Special rules regarding fasting.
- 3. To receive the Holy Eucharist at least once a year during the Paschal season.¹⁵
- 4. To go to Confession at least once a year unless you are guilty of mortal sin or need counsel. ¹⁶
- 5. To give tithes to support the Catholic Church and her Catholic pastors.
- 6. To observe all the laws of the Catholic Church.

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Prayers before Confession

Sorrow and Amendment

O my God, I am very sorry for all my sins. I promise that I will try to be good and never hurt thee again by sin. Dear Jesus, help me. Mother of God, pray that I may please thy Son by true sorrow for my sins.

Receive My Confession

Receive my confession, O most loving and gracious Lord Jesus Christ, only hope for the salvation of my soul. Grant to me true contrition so that I may by penance make satisfaction for my many sins. Savior of the world, O good Jesus, who didst give thyself to the death of the cross to save sinners, look upon me, a repentant sinner; have pity on me and give me the light to know my sins, true sorrow for them, and a firm purpose of never committing them again.

O gracious Virgin Mary, Immaculate Mother of Jesus, I implore thee to obtain for me by thy powerful intercession these graces from thy divine Son.

St. Joseph, pray for me.

Manner of Confessing

Sometime before you enter the confessional, examine your conscience so that you will have a list of your sins to confess.

When your turn comes, go into the confession box. Make the Sign of the Cross and wait until the priest opens the little window. Say what you have been taught to say, or you may say:

"Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been (*say how long*) since my last confession. Since then I have committed these sins..."

Now tell all your sins and how many times you have committed each. If there is something you don't know how to tell, just say, "Please help me, Father," and the priest will help you. After you have told all your sins, say what you have been taught to say, or you may say:

"That is all, Father."

The priest will absolve you of your sins unless there is a reason not to, which he will tell you (for example, if he believes that you do not have a firm purpose of amendment). The priest will tell you what to do for your penance. Then he will tell you to say the Act of Contrition, p. 17. When your confession is done, leave the confessional. You must then do the penance that the priest imposed on you.

If no Catholic priest is available in the foreseeable future to confess to, confess to God and he will remit your sins, as long as your confession was sincere. And if your sin was mortal, you must take on some penance for it. ¹⁹ If it was venial, then the penances you do during Advent, Lent, and Ember days will suffice.

Thanksgiving for Remittance of Sins

O almighty and most merciful God, I give thee thanks with all the powers of my soul for this and all other mercies, graces, and blessings bestowed on me; and prostrating myself at thy sacred feet, I offer myself to be henceforth forever thine. Let nothing in life or death ever separate me from thee! I renounce with my whole soul all my treasons against thee and all the abominations and sins of my past life. I renew my promises made in baptism, and from this moment I dedicate myself forever to thy love and service. divine Savior, have mercy on us and restore us to thy grace. Radiate thy divine countenance upon us, and bless us now and forever. Novena to the Holy Spirit



Recited from the day after Ascension Day through the Vigil of Pentecost.

Foreword

The novena to the Holy Spirit is the oldest of all novenas since it was first made at the direction of our Lord when he sent his Apostles back to Jerusalem to await the coming of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost Day under the New Covenant. Addressed to God the Holy Spirit, the third Person of the Blessed Trinity, it is a powerful plea for the grace, faith, wisdom, strength, fear, and love needed by every Catholic to be saved.

First Day

Holy Spirit! Lord of Light! / From thy clear celestial height / Thy pure beaming radiance give!

The Holy Spirit: God the Holy Spirit, the third divine Person of the most holy Trinity, inspires and sanctifies souls. He gives men the grace to know, fear, love, worship, and obey God and thus to save their souls. And he dwells in sanctified souls; that is, in the souls of the faithful who are in the state of grace. Without the Holy Spirit and his grace and other spiritual gifts, no man can do or think anything good. The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of light, of strength, and of love. With his bountiful gifts he inflames the heart with the fear and love of God; enlightens the mind with true wisdom, the Catholic faith; and strengthens the will so that we can obey all of God's commandments. Hence we ought to invoke the Divine Spirit daily, for "the Spirit also helpeth our infirmity. For we know not what we should pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself asketh for us with unspeakable groanings." (Rom. 8:26)

<u>Prayer</u>

Almighty and eternal God, who hast vouchsafed to regenerate us by water and the Holy Spirit and hast given us forgiveness of sins, vouchsafe to send forth from heaven thy Holy Spirit upon us, the Spirit of Wisdom and Understanding, the Spirit of Counsel and Fortitude, the Spirit of Knowledge and Piety, and fill us with the Spirit of Holy Fear. Amen.

Our Father; Hail Mary; Glory Be; Act of Consecration to the Holy Spirit; Prayer for Gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Act of Consecration to the Holy Spirit

On my knees before the great multitude of heavenly witnesses, I offer myself, soul and body, to thee, eternal Spirit of God. I adore the brightness of thy purity, the unerring keenness of thy justice, and the might of thy love. Thou art the strength and light of my soul. In thee I live and move and am. I desire never to grieve thee by unfaithfulness to grace, and I pray with all my heart to be kept from

every sin. Mercifully guard my every thought; and grant that I may always watch for thy light, and listen to thy voice, and follow thy gracious inspirations. I cling to thee and give myself to thee and ask thee, by thy compassion, to watch over me in my weakness. Holding the pierced feet of Jesus, and looking at his five wounds, and trusting in his precious blood, and adoring his opened side and stricken heart, I implore thee, adorable Spirit, helper of my infirmity, so to keep me in thy grace that I may never sin against thee. Give me grace, O Holy Spirit, Spirit of the Father and the Son, to say to thee always and everywhere: "Speak, Lord, for thy servant heareth. What wilt thou have me do?" Amen.

Prayer for Gifts of the Holy Spirit

O Lord Jesus Christ, who before ascending into heaven didst promise to send the Holy Spirit to finish thy work in the souls of thy Apostles and disciples, deign to grant the same Holy Spirit to me that he may perfect in my soul the work of thy grace and thy love.

Grant me the Spirit of Fear, that I may be filled with a loving fear and reverence toward God and may dread in any way to displease him;

The Spirit of Piety, that I may find the service of God sweet and amiable;

The Spirit of Fortitude, that I may bear my cross with thy help and may overcome with courage all the obstacles that oppose my salvation;

The Spirit of Knowledge of the Catholic faith, that I may know God and know what God has called me to be and grow perfect in the science of the saints;

The Spirit of Understanding, to enlighten my mind with the light of thy divine truth;

The Spirit of Counsel, that I may ever choose the surest way of pleasing God and gaining heaven;

The Spirit of Wisdom, that I may place the things of heaven above the perishable things of this world.

Mark me, dear Lord, with the sign of thy true disciples and animate me in all things with thy Spirit. Amen.

Second Day

Come, thou Father of the poor! / Come, with treasures which endure! / Come, thou light of all that live!

The Gift of Fear: The gift of fear fills us with a sovereign respect for God and makes us dread nothing so much as to offend him by sin. It is a fear that arises not only from the thought of Gehenna but, more importantly, from sentiments of love, reverence, and filial submission to our heavenly Father. It is the fear that is the beginning of wisdom, detaching us from the worldly pleasures that could in any way separate us from God. "They that fear the Lord will prepare their hearts and in his sight will sanctify their souls." (Eccus. 2:20)

<u>Prayer</u>

Come, O Blessed Spirit of Holy Fear, penetrate my inmost heart, that I may set thee, my Lord and God, before my face forever. Help me to shun all things that can offend thee, and make me worthy to appear before the pure eyes of thy divine majesty in heaven, where thou livest and reignest in the unity of the ever Blessed Trinity, God, forever and ever. Amen.

Our Father; Hail Mary; Glory Be; Act of Consecration to the Holy Spirit; Prayer for Gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Third Day

Thou, of all consolers best, / Visiting the troubled breast / Dost refreshing peace bestow.

The Gift of Piety: Piety is a gift of God which makes us devout, reverent, and zealous in his service. It begets in our hearts a filial affection for God as our most loving Father. It inspires us to love and respect, for his sake, persons and things consecrated to him, as well as those who are vested with his authority. A Catholic who is filled with the gift of piety finds the practice of his religion not a burdensome duty but a delightful service. Where there is love, there is no labor.

Prayer

Come, O Blessed Spirit of Piety, possess my heart. Kindle therein such a love for God that I may find satisfaction in his service, and for his sake lovingly submit to all legitimate authority. Amen.

Our Father; Hail Mary; Glory Be; Act of Consecration to the Holy Spirit; Prayer for Gifts of the Holy Spirit.

Fourth Day

Thou in toil art comfort sweet, / Pleasant coolness in the heat, / Solace in the midst of woe.

The Gift of Fortitude: By the gift of fortitude, the soul is strengthened against natural fear and supported to the end in the performance of duty. Fortitude imparts to the will an impulse and energy which move it to undertake without hesitancy the most arduous tasks, to face dangers, to trample underfoot human respect, and to endure without complaint the slow martyrdom of even lifelong tribulation. "He that shall persevere to the end, he shall be saved." (Mt. 24:13)

Prayer

Come, O Blessed Spirit of Fortitude, uphold my soul in time of troubles and adversity, sustain my efforts after holiness, strengthen my weakness, give me courage against all the assaults of my enemies, that I may never be overcome and separated from thee, my God and greatest good. Amen.

Fifth Day

It unmasks the pretense of creatures, reveals their deceptions, and points out their only true purpose as instruments in the service of God. It shows us the loving care of God even in adversity and directs us to glorify him in every circumstance of life. Guided by its light, we put first things first and prize the friendship of God

above all else. Knowledge of the Catholic faith is a fountain of life to him that possesses it.

<u>Prayer</u>

Come, O Blessed Spirit of Knowledge, grant me the gift of knowledge of the Catholic faith and to know the will of the Father and the knowledge of things necessary for my vocation and station in life. We begin to "walk worthy of God in all things pleasing, and increasing in the knowledge of God." (Col 1:10)

Come, O Spirit of Understanding, and enlighten our minds that we may know and believe all the mysteries of salvation and may merit at last to see the eternal light of thy Light and in the light of thy glory to have a clear vision of thee and the Father and the Son. Amen.

The Gift of Counsel: The gift of counsel enables us to consult knowledgeable, wise, and reputable persons regarding uncertain matters in order to form a proper judgment. It enables us to judge rightly what must be done, especially in difficult circumstances. Counsel applies the principles furnished by faith, knowledge, and understanding to the innumerable concrete cases that confront us in the course of our daily duty as parents, teachers, public servants, and Christian citizens.

<u>Prayer</u>

Come, O Spirit of Counsel, help, guide, and inspire me in all my ways and judgments that I may always do thy holy will. Incline my heart to that which is good, turn it away from all that is evil, and direct me by the straight path of thy commandments to that goal of everlasting life for which I long. Amen.

Eighth Day

Wisdom enlightens the heart and mind to discern and relish things divine, in the appreciation of which earthly joys pale in comparison whilst the cross of Christ yields a divine sweetness, according to the words of the Savior: "Take up thy cross and follow me...for my yoke is sweet and my burden light." (Mt. 16:24, 11:30)

Some gifts that move men toward justification and perfection are faith, hope, charity, prudence, temperance, fortitude, justice, fear of the Lord, counsel, understanding, piety, wisdom, knowledge, chastity, peace, patience, humility, mildness, moderation, goodness, longsuffering, fidelity, joy, and benignity. Some vocational gifts are the priesthood, governing, managing, soldiery, law enforcement, ranching, farming, perpetual virginity, marriage, widowhood, and carpentry. Some special power gifts are miracles, prophecy, casting out devils, and discernment.

Prayer

Come, O Divine Spirit, and grant me all the spiritual gifts I need to be a good Catholic and be saved, to live a holy and honest life, to faithfully and joyfully fulfill my vocation, and to humbly thank thee for any special powers that thou mayest give me for the glory of God and the salvation of souls. May I never weary in the service of God; but by continued faithful submission to thy inspirations, may I merit to be united forever with thee in the love of the Father and the Son. Amen.

Day Four



Long Exorcism Prayer

Preliminary Prayers

KNEEL

If available, a Catholic priest must lead the prayers. If not, then the head of the household or of the group must lead them.

Recite the brief renunciation of Satan:

I renounce Satan with all his works and pomps and pledge myself to Jesus Christ forever.

Then recite the Act of Contrition, p. 91; The Confiteor and Absolution, p. 102; and the Litany of the Old and New Testament Saints, p. 116. Light the charcoal for the incense if available.

REMAIN KNEELING

♣ In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Let God arise and let his enemies be scattered, and let them that hate him flee from before his face!

As smoke vanisheth, so let them vanish away; as wax melteth before the fire, so let the wicked perish at the presence of God. (Ps. 67:2-3) Judge thou, O Lord, them that wrong me; overthrow them that fight against me.

Let them be confounded and ashamed that seek after my soul. Let them be turned back and be confounded that devise evil against me. Let them become as dust before the wind, and let the angel of the Lord straighten them. Let their way become dark and slippery, and let the angel of the Lord pursue them.

For without cause they have hidden their net for me unto destruction, without cause they have upbraided my soul.

Let the snare, which he knoweth not, come upon him; and let the net which he hath hidden catch him; and into that very snare let him fall. But my soul shall rejoice in the Lord and shall be delighted in his salvation. (Ps. 34:1, 4-9)

Glory Be...

O most glorious Prince of the heavenly army, St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle, in our wrestling against Principalities and Powers, against the rulers of the world of this darkness, against the spirits of wickedness in the high places. (Eph. 6:12) Come to the aid of men, whom God created incorruptible and to the image of his own likeness he made him (Wis. 2:23), and from the tyranny of the devil he bought him at a great price. (1 Cor. 6:20)

Fight the battles of the Lord today with the army of the blessed angels, as once thou didst fight against Lucifer, the leader of pride, and his apostate angels, and they prevailed not, neither was their place found anymore in heaven. And that great dragon was cast out, that old serpent, who is called the devil and Satan, who seduceth the whole world. And he was cast unto the earth, and his angels were thrown down with him. (Apoc. 12:8-9)

Behold, the ancient enemy and murderer strongly raises his head! Transformed into an angel of light, with the entire horde of wicked spirits he goes about everywhere and takes possession of the earth so that therein he may blot out the name of God and of his Christ and try to steal away,

afflict, corrupt, and send men into everlasting damnation.

On men corrupt in heart and depraved in mind, the wicked dragon pours out like a most foul river the poison of his villainy, a spirit of lying, impiety, and blasphemy, and the deadly breath of lust and of all iniquities and vices. Her most crafty enemies have engulfed the Catholic Church, the spouse of the Immaculate Lamb; with sorrows they have drenched her with wormwood, on her desirable things they have laid their wicked hands.

Where the See of Blessed Peter and the Chair of Truth have been set up for the light of the Gentiles, there they have placed the throne of the abomination of their wickedness so that the Pastor having been struck they may also be able to scatter the flock. Therefore, O thou unconquerable leader, be present with the people of God and against the spiritual wickedness which is bursting in upon them, and bring them the victory.

The Holy Catholic Church venerates thee as its guardian and patron, and it glories in the fact that thou art its defender against the wicked powers of earth and Gehenna. To thee the Lord has assigned the souls of the elect to be placed in heavenly bliss. Beseech the God of Peace to crush Satan under our feet, that he may no more be able to hold men captive and to harm the Catholic Church.

Offer our prayers in the sight of the most High so that the mercies of the Lord may quickly come to our aid, that thou mayest seize the dragon, the ancient serpent, who is the devil and Satan, and that having bound him thou mayest cast him into the bottomless pit so that he may no more seduce the nations. - **R.** The Lion of the tribe of Juda, the Root of David, hath conquered.

- **R.** And let my cry come unto thee.
- L. The Lord be with thee.
- **R.** And with thy spirit.

LET US PRAY: O God, and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, we invoke thy holy name and we humbly implore thy mercy, that by the intercession of the Mother of God Mary Immaculate ever Virgin, of blessed Michael the Archangel, of blessed Joseph the spouse of the same Blessed Virgin, of the blessed Apostles Peter and Paul and of all the saints thou wouldst deign to afford us help against Satan and all the other unclean spirits and against whatever wanders throughout the world to do harm to the human race and to ruin souls. STAND

If incense is available, recite the Blessing of Liturgical Incense, p. 194, and place the incense on the charcoal. Then incense the church or other place in which the exorcism is performed.

cross is to be made with a crucifix. If an individual is being exorcised, then the sign of the cross is made over him. If the exorcism is for the whole group present, then the leader, armed with a crucifix, must make the sign of the cross with the crucifix at each \blacksquare , beginning in front of him, then to his right, then behind him, then to his left, and then back again to the front, covering all directions and continuing till there are no more ♥ symbols. The leader does not have to turn his whole body but must make sure the crucifix is facing in each direction when making the sign of the cross. The leader should speak forcefully and with authority.

We exorcize thee, O every unclean spirit, Satanic power, infernal invader, wicked legion, assembly and sect; in the name and by the power of our Lord Jesus Christ ¥ may thou be snatched away and driven from the Church of God and from the souls made to the image of God and redeemed by the precious blood of the Divine Lamb 4. Most cunning serpent, thou shalt no more dare to deceive the human race, persecute the Catholic Church, torment God's elect, and sift them as wheat ♥. The most high God commands thee ♣, he with whom in thy great insolence thou still claimest to be equal, he who wants all men to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. (1 Tim. 2:4)

God the Father commands thee ♥: God the Son commands thee ♥: God the Holy Spirit commands thee ♥. The majesty of Christ, the eternal Word of God made flesh, commands thee ♥; he who to save our race outdone through thy envy "humbled himself, being obedient unto death, even to the death of the cross" (Phil. 2:8); he who has built his Church on the firm rock and declared that the gates of Gehenna shall never prevail against her because he will dwell with her "all days, even to the consummation of the world." (Mt. 28:20) The sacred sign of the cross commands thee ♣, as does also the power of the mysteries of the Christian faith ♥. The glorious Mother of God, the Virgin Mary, commands thee ♥; she who by her humility and from the first moment of her Immaculate Conception rebuked thee and thy pride. The faith of the holy Apostles Peter and Paul and of the other apostles commands thee \blacksquare . The blood of the martyrs and the pious intercession of all the saints command thee ₹.

Thus, cursed dragon and thee diabolical legion, we adjure thee by the Living God \(\mathbb{A} \), by the True God \(\mathbb{A} \), by the Holy God \(\mathbb{A} \), by the God who "so loved the world, as to give his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him may not perish, but may have life everlasting" (Jn. 3:16), stop deceiving human creatures and pouring out to them the poison of everlasting damnation. Stop harming the Catholic Church and ensnaring

her liberty. Begone, Satan, inventor and master of all deceit, enemy of man's salvation. Give place to Christ in whom thou hast found none of thy works. Give place to the one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church, acquired by Christ at the price of his blood. Stoop beneath the powerful hand of God. Tremble and flee when we invoke the holy and terrible name of JESUS; this name which causes Gehenna to tremble; this name to which the Virtues, Powers, and Dominations of heaven are humbly submissive; this name which the Cherubim and Seraphim praise unceasingly, repeating:

Holy, holy is the Lord, God of armies!

While reciting the Exorcism Prayer of St. Michael the Archangel, p. 139, holy water is sprinkled on the persons present and in the place where the exorcism is being done and the property by processing around the perimeter of the property with one person leading with the incensor, the next carrying a crucifix, one sprinkling holy water, and the others following while reciting the Exorcism Prayer of St. Michael. When they come to the end of the procession, the leader must make the sign of the cross with a crucifix while sprinkling holy water beginning in front of him, then to his right, then behind him, and then to his left, which will go out to the whole world. When the people present return home, they must do the same with their homes and property.

Then repeat 3 times:

- L. Most Sacred Heart of Jesus.
- R. Have mercy on us.

And the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us.

To conclude the chaplet, say:

Holy Infant Jesus, bless us and protect us!

St. Jude




Prayer to St. Jude in Trials

- **L.** Oh, that our life be set. **R.** On keeping your precepts.
- L. For the crooked ways will be made straight. R. And the rough places plain.
- **L.** God has given his angels charge over you. **R.** To guard you in all your undertakings.

- **L.** The Lord be with you. **R.** May He also be with you.



And by thy intercession may God (heal my (mention your specific bodily afflictions) and) make my body strong enough to do the spiritual work he has given me and to do my daily duties. Amen. (RJMI)

Prayer in Pain and Suffering

O Lord Jesus Christ, accept my sufferings which I desire to unite with thine. Sanctify this affliction so that every pain I feel may purify my soul and bring it nearer to thee, that I may be more united to thee. Grant that I may welcome the sufferings which will make me more like thee. Stand by me with thy supporting grace, sanctify each pain, and sustain my weakness so that I do not become overwhelmed by pain. Come now to my help, O Lord, and so purify my soul that I may be spared everlasting sufferings; let me fly to the embrace of thy love forever.

Lord Jesus, thou hast invited all that labor and are burdened to come to thee for refreshment. Behold now thy servant, afflicted and oppressed, who has come to thee for help; relieve me, I beseech thee, thou who art merciful. O thou who comforted the martyrs in their torments and refreshed them with heavenly sweetness on the rack and in the fire, renew thy mercies to me thine servant. Defend me against all temptation; suffer not the enemy to take advantage of me, but grant me thy heavenly strength, the fullness of thy grace and peace. O Lord, by thy Cross and Passion strengthen me. Lord, let this cup pass from me;

nevertheless, not my will but thine be done. Amen.

Prayer to Offer Up Pain in Sickness

Dear Lord, thou hast sent me this affliction so that I may share in thy sufferings for our sins. Grant me the grace that I may draw closer to thee for consolation and not turn away from thee in my misery. O my Savior, grant me that precious grace to offer up my pain to atone for sins as thou didst in thy sacred Passion. Help me to imitate thy patience, to bear my cross willingly, to not complain, and to use my sufferings for reparation for my sins or for those of others, as thou dost see fit. In this time of distress and pain, I ask, I seek, and I knock for the graces of endurance, perseverance, and, above all, trustful submission to thy divine will, for thy greater glory and my own good. Amen.

Rules for a Sick Catholic

1. Receive your sickness from the hands of your heavenly Father dealing with you as with a child.

- 2. Look on it as a loving correction for your sins and as a summons to prepare more carefully for death.
- 3. Practice the virtues of patience and submission to the will of God; deepen your repentance and offer yourself to God to suffer, if it pleases him, still greater pains; give thanks for the blessings you enjoy.
- 4. In any dangerous illness, let your first care be to go to or send for a Catholic priest. If you are a catechumen, he can baptize you; and if you are of the faithful, he will hear your confession and if necessary, administer extreme unction to you. If no Catholic priest is available, you can be baptized by anyone if you are a catechumen; and if you are of the faithful, you can confess to God and he will remit your sins.
- 5. Beg your doctor, family members, and friends to give you timely notice if your illness is dangerous and not to flatter you with false hopes of recovery.
- 6. Make the best use of the time you have; only admit good Catholics, good-willed catechumens, or good-

- willed non-Catholics as visitors. Let your conversation be mostly on spiritual matters.
- 7. Settle your temporal affairs in order to give yourself more entirely to spiritual matters.
- 8. Meditate often on our Lord's Passion.
- 9. Bear in mind St. Augustine's words: However innocent your life may have been, no Christian ought to venture to die in any other state than that of a penitent.

For Sick Non-Catholics

Prayer for a Sick Non-Catholic

O God of the Holy Catholic Church, we pray that by the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Raphael you will heal (*N*.), a non-Catholic, in body and more importantly in soul so that he may believe in the Catholic faith and enter the Catholic Church and thus have a hope to save his immortal soul. Amen. (RJMI)

PRAYERS FOR THE DYING



How to Deal with the Dying

If the dying person is not Catholic

If the dying person is not Catholic, you must tell him that if he does not convert and become a member of the Catholic Church and die as a good Catholic, he cannot go to heaven but instead he will go to Gehenna and suffer everlasting pains. If he does not want to convert, then all you can do is offer up prayers, penances, and other good deeds for his soul. If he allows you, you can pray for his conversion by his bedside.

If he wants to convert, the primary thing he must believe in is the *Basic Catholic Profession of Faith*. That would be enough if he does not have time to study the *Profession of Faith for the Days of the Great Apostasy*. But he must promise to learn it and consent to it if he has time. And he must promise to pray, study the faith, do penance, and do other good works if he has time, and strive to live as a good Catholic, as listed in RJMI's article Things Catholics Must Believe and Do.

If the dying person is a catechumen

If the dying person is a catechumen, you must bring him into the Catholic Church either by baptism if he was not validly baptized or, if he was validly baptized, by his abjuration or a profession of faith that serves as an abjuration.

Methods for bringing the dying person into the Catholic Church

By baptism

If available, a Catholic bishop or priest must administer the baptism; if not, then a Catholic layman; if not, then a Catholic laywoman; if not, then a male catechumen; if not, then a female catechumen; if not, then a non-Catholic male; if not, then a non-Catholic female may administer the sacrament. To learn how baptism must be administered when no Catholic bishop or priest is available, see RJMI book *Sacraments without a Priest*: The Sacrament of Baptism without a Priest.

By abjuration

If the dying non-Catholic or catechumen was validly baptized, then he enters the Catholic Church by abjuration or a profession of faith that serves as an abjuration. And then, if available, a Catholic bishop lays his hands upon him at which point he enters the Catholic Church. If a Catholic bishop is not available, then a Catholic priest must lay his hands upon the convert.

If no Catholic bishop or Catholic priest is available in the foreseeable future, then the convert must abjure before a Catholic layman. He enters the Catholic Church as soon as he signs or otherwise consents to the abjuration or profession of faith.

And if a Catholic layman is not available in the foreseeable future, he must abjure before a non-Catholic to witness his abjuration.

And if there is no one willing to witness his abjuration in the foreseeable future, he can abjure and make a profession of faith by himself.

If it is the first time the convert entered the Catholic Church, he does not have to confess to a Catholic priest the sins he committed previous to entering the Catholic Church because the sanctifying grace of baptism remits all of his sins and all the punishment due to his sins the instant he entered the Catholic Church.

A convert who re-enters the Catholic Church and thus was a member of the Catholic Church before he fell away must confess to a Catholic priest the mortal sins he committed since his last sincere confession when he was inside the Catholic Church to have them remitted. He does that after he enters the Catholic Church by abjuration. If a Catholic priest is not available in the foreseeable future, then he must confess his sins to God and God will remit them as long as his confession was sincere.²⁵

If the dying person is a member of the Catholic Church

If the dying person is a member of the Catholic Church, you must do the following:

Pray the *Prayers for the Dying from* the Roman Ritual.²⁶ These prayers are only for members of the Catholic Church.

Have him reaffirm his faith by consenting to the Basic Catholic Profession of Faith and the Profession of Faith for the Days of the Great Apostasy. If he has learned none or only part of the Profession of Faith for the Days of the Great Apostasy, then he must promise to learn all of it and consent to it if he has time.

You must help him to make a sincere confession to a Catholic priest if one is available. If no Catholic priest is available, then he must confess his sins to God, and God will remit them if his confession was sincere. You can help him examine his conscience. (See in this book <u>Confession</u>, p. 98.)

If the sick or dying person is in the hospital

If the sick or dying Catholic is in the hospital, his Catholic family or friends, if possible, should put on the door of his hospital room a posting that only true Catholics are allowed to enter the room for any religious purposes. Catholic family members or friends should alter times and visits to pray their daily prayers, if possible, with the sick or dying Catholic. A holy picture or two in the room is recommended and a Crucifix. Have a Rosary and small Holy Water bottle on the bed stand as well. Extra prayers for the dying are needed, as well. The Exorcism should be prayed and the reading of the Examination of Conscience and the Profession of Faith (first, the Basic Catholic Profession of Faith and then the Profession of Faith for the Days of the Great Apostasy). MLR's external hard drive which contains RJMI's lectures and movies are a great benefit also. "For I was hungry, and you gave me [spiritual food] to eat; I was thirsty, and you gave me [spiritual water] to drink." (Mt. 25:35)

Prayers for the Dying from the Roman Ritual

These prayers are only for members of the Catholic Church who are dying. If a non-Catholic does not want to convert, you should offer prayers for his conversion instead.

Spiritual Assistance to the Dying

If a Catholic priest is not available, then a Catholic layman may perform this service, minus the administration of the Holy Eucharist and Extreme Unction.

If possible, pray the Long Exorcism prayer in the room of the dying person. If not, then pray it for him in another place. (See in this book Long Exorcism Prayer, p. 137.)

The minister recommends and encourages him to recite or elicit, as long as he remains conscious, the acts of faith, hope, and charity, and

arouses in him other virtuous dispositions, namely:

That he firmly believe all articles of faith, all that the one, holy, Catholic and apostolic Church believes and teaches;

That he firmly believe all the points in the <u>Basic Catholic Profession of</u> <u>Faith</u>, composed by RJMI;

That he firmly believe all the points in the <u>Profession of Faith for the</u> <u>Days of the Great Apostasy</u>, composed by RJMI. If he has not yet read it, then he must promise to read and consent to if he has time;

That he examine his conscience and make a sincere confession of his sins (See in this book Confession, p. 98.)

That for the love of God he charitably forgive all who have offended him or have been inimical to him:

That he ask pardon of all whom he has offended in word or deed;

That he have confidence that our Lord Jesus Christ, in his boundless clemency will be merciful to him as long as his confession is sincere, and that through the merits of his sacred passion and the intercession of Blessed Mary and all the angels and saints, he will come to possess life everlasting;

That in resignation to God's will and as penance for his sins he bear patiently all the sufferings and burdens of his sickness;

That if the Lord be gracious enough to restore his health, he purpose in future to guard against sin with all his power and keep the commandments of God.

Tell him, moreover, to pray the penitential psalms, as well as the daily prayers for Catholics listed in RJMI's article <u>Things Catholics Must Believe and Do</u>.

Rite of the Apostolic Blessing

The apostolic blessing at the hour of death should be imparted, following the reception of the last sacraments (Extreme Unction, Confession, and the Holy Eucharist), to those who desire it while still rational and conscious. It may likewise be granted

to any of the faithful who has given any indication of such desire, or who has seemed contrite before becoming unconscious or irrational. But it must be denied absolutely to catechumens, the excommunicated and other non-Catholics, and to the faithful who are impenitent or who die in patent mortal sin.

The pastor or another priest who assists the sick person, vested in surplice and purple stole, on entering the room where the sick person lies, says:

L. God's peace be in this home. **R.** And in all who live here.

Next he sprinkles the sick person, the room, and the bystanders with holy water, saying:

L. Purify me with hyssop, Lord, and I shall be clean of sin. Wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow. Have mercy on me, God, in your great kindness.

Glory be...

L. Purify me with hyssop, Lord, and I shall be clean of sin. Wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.

The priest hears the confession of the sick person and absolves him. If no Catholic priest is available in the foreseeable future, the minister tells the sick person to make a sincere confession to God, and God will remit his sins. He then exhorts him to invoke the holy name of Jesus, to bear his sufferings patiently in expiation for past sins, to resign himself fully to God's holy will, even to the extent of accepting death resignedly in satisfaction for punishment due to sin.

The priest consoles him, instilling confidence that by the divine bounty he will receive remission of temporal punishment and everlasting life, as long as his confession was sincere. Then he says:

- L. Our help is in the name of the Lord.
- **R.** Who made heaven and earth.
- L. Do not keep in mind, O Lord, the offenses of your servant nor take vengeance on his (her) sins.
- L. Lord, have mercy. R. Christ, have mercy. L. Lord, have mercy.

Our Father...

- L. Save your servant.
- **R.** Who trusts in you, my God.
- L. Lord, heed my prayer.
- **R.** And let my cry be heard by you.
- L. The Lord be with you.
- **R.** And with your spirit.

Let us pray.

- L. Merciful God, kind Father, our sole comfort, who wills that no one who believes and trusts in you should perish, in your boundless love look favorably on your servant, N., whom the true faith and Christian hope commend to you. Come to him (her) with your saving power, and by the suffering and death of your onlybegotten Son, be pleased to grant him (her) pardon and remission of his sins. Let his (her) soul at the hour of its departure find in you a merciful judge, and cleansed of every stain in the blood of your Son, let him (her) be found worthy of passing into everlasting life; through Christ our Lord. R. Amen.
- L. May our Lord Jesus Christ, who gave to his blessed apostle Peter the power of binding and loosing, mercifully accept your confession, in the name of the Father, and of the Son, + and of the Holy Spirit. R. Amen.
- L. By the sacred mysteries of mankind's redemption, may almighty God remit your sins and punishment due to your sin, and may he open to you the gates of Paradise and admit you to everlasting happiness. R. Amen.

The priest should add the prayers given below in the rite for commending a departing soul, and he should exhort the bystanders to pray for the dying person.

Rite for Commending a Departing Soul to God

Whenever a pastor goes to carry out the ceremony of commending a departing soul, he should, if possible, be assisted by at least another cleric. The latter will carry the vessel with holy water, a surplice, and a purple stole. Arriving at the sick-room, the priest puts on the surplice and stole, and then entering the room says:

L. God's peace be in this home. **R.** And in all who live here.

Next he sprinkles the sick person, the room, and the bystanders with holy water, saying the antiphon:

L. Sprinkle me with hyssop, and I shall be cleansed. Thou shalt wash me, and I shall be made whiter than snow.

Then he presents a crucifix to the dying person to be kissed, and at the same time says a few words to him of hope for salvation. Moreover, he places the crucifix within sight of the patient, so that gazing on it he may take comfort from the hope which it symbolizes.

Then a candle is lighted. The priest and all the bystanders kneel and pray the short litany as follows:

L. Lord, have mercy. R. Christ, have mercy. L. Lord, have mercy.

Holy Mary,

Pray for him (her). (repeat after each versicle)

All ye holy angels and archangels, Holy Abel,

All ye choirs of the just,

Holy Abraham,

St. John the Baptist,

St. Joseph,

All ye holy patriarchs and prophets,

St. Peter,

St. Paul,

St. Andrew,

St. John,

All ye holy apostles and evangelists,

All ye holy disciples of our Lord,

All ye holy Innocents,

St. Stephen,

St. Lawrence,

All ye holy martyrs,

St. Sylvester,

St. Gregory,

St. Augustine,

All ye holy bishops and confessors,

St. Benedict,

St. Mary Magdalen,

St. Lucy,

All ye holy monks and hermits

All ye holy virgins and widows,

All ye holy men and women, saints of God, intercede for him (her).

Be merciful,

Spare him (her), O Lord.

Be merciful, Deliver him (her), O Lord. (repeat after each versicle)

From your wrath,
From the peril of death,
From an evil end,
From the pains of Gehenna,
By your nativity,
By your cross and passion,
By your death and burial,
By your glorious resurrection,
By your wondrous ascension,
By the grace of the Holy Spirit, the
Advocate,
On the day of judgment,

- L. We sinners, R. beg you to hear us. L. That you may spare him (her), R. we beg you to hear us.
- L. Lord, have mercy. R. Christ, have mercy. L. Lord, have mercy.

And as the soul struggles in its death agony, the following prayers are recited:

- L. Depart, Christian soul, from this world, in the name of God the Father almighty, anchor of the Most Holy Trinity; in the name of Jesus Christ, Son of the living God, who suffered for you; in the name of the Holy Spirit who sanctified you; in the name of the glorious and blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God; in the name of St. Joseph, her illustrious spouse; in the name of the Angels and Archangels, Thrones and Dominations, Virtues, Powers and Principalities, Cherubim and Seraphim; in the name of the patriarchs and prophets, the holy apostles and evangelists, the holy martyrs and confessors, the holy monks and hermits; in the name of the holy virgins and all the holy men and women of God. May you rest in peace this day and your abode be in holy Sion; through Christ our Lord. R. Amen.
- L. God of mercy, God of pity, in your great compassion, you blot out the sins of the penitent and cancel the debt of past misdeeds by your gracious pardon. May it please you now to look with favor on your servant, *N*., and hear him (her) as he (she) pleads for the forgiveness of all his (her) sins, sincerely acknowledging them. All-merciful Father, grant his (her) request, and refashion in him (her) whatever has

- been marred by human frailty or defiled by the devil's treachery and by sin. Bless this member of your Catholic Church whom you have redeemed. Have pity, Lord, have pity for his (her) tears and sighs, for his (her) only hope is in your mercy. Grant him (her) the grace of being reconciled to you; through Christ our Lord, **R**. Amen.
- L. I commend you, dear brother (sister), to almighty God, and entrust you to him whose creature you are. Having paid the debt of human nature in surrendering your soul, may you return to your Maker who formed you out of the dust of the earth. May your spirit, as it leaves the body, be met by the noble company of angels. May the high court of the apostles come forward to plead for you. May the victorious army of white-robed martyrs welcome you. May the lilywhite throng of glorious confessors surround you. May the joyous choir of virgins escort you. May St. Joseph, the tender patron of the dying sustain you in high hope. May the holy Virgin Mary, Mother of God, turn kindly eyes on you. May Jesus Christ appear before you with gentle and joyous countenance and appoint a place for you in his presence forever. Far from you be all the terror of darkness, the hiss of flames, the anguish of torment. Far from you be the accursed Satan and his accomplices. Let him shrink, abashed into the vast chaos of everlasting night, when you draw near with your escort of angels. Let God arise and his enemies be scattered; let those who hate him flee at his coming! Let them vanish like smoke; as wax melts before the fire, so let sinners perish before the face of God, while the good triumph and make merry in his presence. Shame and confusion come upon Gehenna's legions, and let Satan's cohorts not dare to bar your way. May Christ, who for your sake was crucified, deliver you from torment. May Christ, who condescended to die for you, deliver you from everlasting death. May Christ, Son of the living God, give you a place in the ever verdant gardens of his Paradise, and may he, the true shepherd, own you for one of his flock. May he absolve you from all your sins, and place you at his
- right hand among his elect. May you see your Redeemer face to face. And standing ever in his presence, may you gaze with delighted eyes on truth itself made manifest. There take your place in the ranks of the blessed, and enjoy the blessed vision of your God forever. **R.** Amen.
- L. Receive your servant, Lord, into the place of salvation, for which he (she) hopes because of your mercy. R. Amen.
- L. Deliver, O Lord, the soul of your servant from the perils of Gehenna, the snares of punishment and tribulation. R. Amen.
- L. Deliver, O Lord, the soul of your servant, as you delivered Noe from the flood, R. Amen.
- L. Deliver, O Lord, the soul of your servant, as you delivered Abraham out of Ur of the Chaldees. R. Amen.
- L. Deliver, O Lord, the soul of your servant, as you delivered Isaac from being sacrificed at the hand of his father, Abraham. R. Amen.
- L. Deliver, O Lord, the soul of your servant, as you delivered Lot from Sodom and the flames of fire. R. Amen.
- L. Deliver, O Lord, the soul of your servant, as you delivered Job from his sufferings. **R.** Amen.
- L. Deliver, O Lord, the soul of your servant, as you delivered Moses from the hand of Pharaoh, king of Egypt. R. Amen.
- L. Deliver, O Lord, the soul of your servant, as you delivered Enoch, Elias, Jeremias and the other prophets from their enemies. R. Amen.
- L. Deliver, O Lord, the soul of your servant, as you delivered Susanna from an unjust condemnation. R. Amen.
- L. Deliver, O Lord, the soul of your servant, as you delivered Daniel from the lions' den. R. Amen.
- L. Deliver, O Lord, the soul of your servant, as you delivered the three young men from the fiery furnace and from the hands of the wicked king. R. Amen.

- L. Deliver, O Lord, the soul of your servant, as you delivered David from the hands of Goliath and King Saul. R. Amen.
- L. Deliver, O Lord, the soul of your servant, as you delivered Peter and Paul from prison. R. Amen.
- L. And as you delivered blessed Thecla, your virgin and martyr, from a thrice frightful torment, so deliver the soul of this servant of yours, and let him (her) rejoice with you in the good things of heaven. R. Amen.
- L. We commend to your keeping, O Lord, the soul of your servant, N., and we beg you, Lord Jesus Christ, Savior of the world, who came on earth for his (her) sake, to bear him (her) aloft to the bosom of the patriarchs. Acknowledge him (her), Lord, as one of your own, not made by strange gods but by you, the only true and living God. For there is no other God than you, and nothing to compare with your works. Lord, let his (her) soul find joy in your presence. Put out of mind his (her) past transgressions and excesses which sinful passions and desires engendered. For although he (she) has sinned, yet he (she) has confessed his sins and does not deny thee, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, but believes, and has zeal for thy honor and faithfully worships thee who created all things.
- L. We beg you, O Lord, remember not the sins of his (her) youth, the faults of ignorance; but in your mercy, keep him (her) in mind in the brightness of your glory. Let the heavens be opened to him (her), let the angels rejoice with him (her). Lord, receive your servant into your kingdom. Let him (her) be welcomed by St. Michael, the archangel of God, who has won the leadership of the heavenly host. Let the holy angels of God come to meet him (her) and lead him (her) into the heavenly city, the heavenly Jerusalem. Let him (her) be received by the blessed apostle Peter to whom God has entrusted the keys of the kingdom of heaven. Let him (her) be helped by St. Paul the apostle chosen to be the herald of the Gospel. Let him (her) find an intercessor in St. John, thy beloved disciple to whom were revealed heavenly mysteries. Let all the holy apostles, to

- whom you gave the power of binding and loosing, pray for him (her). Let all the saints and elect, who in this world endured great suffering for Christ, intercede for him (her). Freed from the bonds of the flesh, may he (she) attain the glory of the kingdom of heaven, through the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with the Father and the Holy Spirit, forever and ever. **R.** Amen.
- L. May Mary, the Virgin Mother of God, loving consoler of those in distress, commend to her Son the soul of his servant, *N*., that by her motherly intercession he (she) may escape the terrors of death, and in her company gladly come to the longed-for home in heaven. R. Amen.
- R. I turn to you for refuge, Saint Joseph, patron of the dying, at whose happy deathbed Jesus and Mary stood watch. By loving vigil which they had at your departure, I earnestly commend to you the soul of this servant, N., in his (her) last agony, so that under your protecting care he (she) may be delivered from the wiles of the devil and from everlasting death and attain everlasting happiness; through Christ our Lord. R. Amen.

If the death agony is prolonged, the priest may read for the dying person from the Gospel of St. John, Chapter 17:1-6 and Chapters 18 and 19.

Prayer to our Lord Jesus Christ, contemplating the various steps of his passion; to be said either by the dying or by another in his stead:

- **L.** We adore you, Christ, and we bless you. **R.** For by your holy cross, you redeemed the world.
- L. O God, in order to redeem the world, you willed to be born of a woman and to submit to circumcision; to be repudiated by the Jews and betrayed with a kiss by the traitor, Judas; to be bound in chains and led like an innocent lamb to the slaughter; to be made a shameful spectacle before Annas, Caiaphas, Pilate, and Herod; to be accused by false witnesses, tortured by scourging and mockery, spat upon, crowned with thorns, whipped and struck with a reed, blindfolded, stripped of your garments, nailed to the cross and

raised up on it, reckoned among robbers, your thirst slaked with vinegar and gall, your side pierced with a lance. Lord, by your holy sufferings, which I, unworthy as I am, recall to mind, and by your holy cross and death, deliver me (or if another says the prayer for the dying person: deliver your servant, N.,) from the pains of Gehenna, and lead me (him) (her) to Paradise, as you led the good thief who was crucified with you. We ask this of you who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit forever and ever. R. Amen.

Psalms 117 and 118 may be added. (See in this book. page <u>31</u>)

Three pious and helpful prayers for the dying together with the Our Father and Hail Mary, to be said during the last agony:

L. Lord, have mercy. R. Christ, have mercy. L. Lord, have mercy.

Our Father... Hail Mary...

- L. Lord Jesus Christ, by your sacred agony and by the prayer you offered for us on Mt. Olivet when your sweat became like drops of blood trickling to the ground, I humbly implore you to offer up the flow of that bloody sweat which poured from you in frightful anguish. Present it to God the Father, to help your servant, N. persevere in his (her) sufferings. Deliver him (her) in the hour of his (her) death from penalties and sufferings which he (she) fears his (her) sins have deserved. We ask this of you who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, God, forever and ever. R. Amen.
- L. Lord, have mercy. R. Christ, have mercy. L. Lord, have mercy.

Our Father, Hail Mary.

L. Lord, Jesus Christ, who for our sake submitted to a shameful death on the cross, I humbly implore you to offer up all the bitter pain and suffering you endured on the cross for us wretched sinners, especially in the hour when your sacred soul left your sacred body. Present them to God the Father, for the soul of your servant *N*. Deliver him (her) in the hour of his (her) death from penalties and sufferings which he (she) fears his

(her) sins have deserved. We ask this of you who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, God, forever and ever. **R.** Amen.

L. Lord, have mercy. R. Christ, have mercy. L. Lord, have mercy.

Our Father, Hail Mary.

L. Lord Jesus Christ, who spoke by the mouth of the prophet: "I love you with undying love; therefore, I have pity on you and have drawn you to myself," (Jer. 31:3) I humbly implore you to offer up for the soul of your servant, N., the very same charity which brought you down from heaven to earth to endure all those bitter sufferings of yours. Present them to God the Father. Deliver him (her) from penalties and sufferings which he (she) fears his (her) sins have deserved, and save his (her) soul in this hour of his (her) departure. Open wide for him (her) the gate of life, and let him (her) rejoice with your saints in everlasting glory. Lord Jesus Christ, font of all mercy, who ransomed us with your precious blood, take pity on the soul of your servant, and graciously lead him (her) to the ever verdant beauty of Heaven and Paradise. There may he (she) live united with you in inseparable love, never to be parted from you and your elect. We ask this of you who live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, God, forever and ever. R. Amen.

At the Moment of Death

At the moment a person is departing this life, then especially should all who are present kneel down and devote themselves to most fervent prayer. The dying person himself should say if he can (otherwise the priest or anyone present pronounces for him distinctly) the words: "Jesus, Jesus, Jesus!" This and the following aspirations may be whispered in his ear from time to time, if it seems advisable:

Into your hands, O Lord, I commend my spirit.

Lord, Jesus Christ, receive my spirit. Holy Mary, pray for me.

Mary, Mother of grace, Mother of mercy, shield me from the enemy, and receive me at the hour of my death.

St. Joseph, pray for me. O blessed Joseph, with Mary, y

O blessed Joseph, with Mary, your virgin-wife, open to me the innermost depths of divine mercy.

Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, I give you my heart and my soul.

Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, assist me in my last agony.

Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, may I sleep and rest in peace with you.

Wherever it is custom, the bell of the parish church should be tolled to announce to the faithful that someone is dying so that they may pray for the person.

When the soul has departed, the following is said immediately:

- L. Come in haste to assist him (her), + you saints of God; Come in haste to meet him (her), you angels of the Lord. Enfold in your arms this soul, + and take your burden heavenwards to the sight of the Most High.
- L. May Christ receive you, for it was he who called you; and may angels carry you unto Abraham's bosom.
- **R.** Enfold in your arms this soul, and take your burden heavenwards to the sight of the Most High.
- L. Lord, grant him (her) everlasting rest, and let perpetual light shine upon him (her).
- **R.** Take your burden heavenwards to the sight of the Most High.
- L. Lord, have mercy. R. Christ, have mercy. L. Lord, have mercy.

Our Father...

- L. Lord, grant him (her) everlasting rest. R. And let perpetual light shine upon him (her).
- **L.** From the gates of Gehenna. **R.** Deliver his (her) soul, O Lord.
- **L.** May he (she) rest in peace. **R.** Amen.
- **L.** Lord, heed my prayer. **R.** And let my cry be heard by you.
- **L.** The Lord be with you. **R.** And with your spirit.
- L. Let us prayer.
- **L.** To you, O God, we commend the soul of your servant, *N*., that he (she) who has departed this life may

evermore live for you. In your all merciful and loving forgiveness, blot out the sins which he (she) has committed. This we ask through Christ our Lord. **R.** Amen.

Then for a conclusion, may be added the following prayer for those who are present.

L. Grant, Of God, that while we lament the departure of this thy servant, we may always remember that we are most certainly to follow him (her). And give us grace to prepare for that last hour by a faithful and holy life, that we may not be surprised by a sudden and unprovided death, but by ever watching, that when thou shall call, we may, with the bridegroom, enter into everlasting glory, through Christ our Lord. R. Amen.

Meanwhile the church bell should be tolled, if such is the custom, so that those who hear it may pray for the departed. The body should be laid out with due respect in a becoming place, and lights placed about it. A small crucifix should be fixed in the hands of the corpse, with the hands resting on the breast; or if a crucifix is not available, the hands should be arranged in the form of a cross. The corpse is to be sprinkled with holy water, and, until it is removed for burial, prayers are to be said for his (her) soul's welfare by those present, both clergy and laity.

Funeral and Burial Services for the Faithful Departed from the Roman Ritual

1) MEETING THE BODY

The priest, vested in surplice, black stole and black cope, meets the body of the deceased in the house or place where the coffin waits, and sprinkles it with holy water saying:

L. Ant. If thou, O Lord...

Psalm 129 (De Profundis)

Out of the depths I have cried to thee, O Lord. Lord, hear my voice. Let thy ears be attentive to the voice of my supplication. If thou, O Lord, wilt mark iniquities, Lord, who shall stand it. For with thee there is merciful forgiveness; and by reason of thy law, I have waited for thee, O Lord. My soul hath relied on his word. My soul hath hoped in the Lord. From the morning watch even until night, let Israel hope in the Lord. Because with the Lord there is mercy and with him plentiful redemption.

L. Ant. If thou, O Lord, wilt mark iniquities, Lord, who shall stand it.

Psalm 50 (See in this book, page 56.)

On entering the church, is sung:

RESPONSORY: Subvenite

- L. Come to his (her) assistance, ye saints of God, meet him (her), ye angels of the Lord, receiving his (her) soul, offering it in the sight of the Most High.
- L. May Christ, who has called thee, receive thee; and may the angels conduct thee into Abraham's bosom.
- **R.** Receiving his (her) soul, offering it in the sight of the Most High.
- L. Everlasting rest grant to him (her), O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him (her).
- **R.** Offering it in the sight of the Most High.

The body is then placed before the sanctuary with the feet towards the altar, if a lay person; the head if a priest. The Office of the Dead is often chanted at that moment (Matins and Lauds, or one Nocturn with Lauds, or Lauds only). Otherwise, the Mass for the Burial begins immediately.

2) THE BURIAL MASS

INTROIT

If the grave has not already been blessed:

Here the body and grave are sprinkled with holy water and incensed. In the cemetery, or where the body is left, the priest intones:

The priest makes the sign of the cross on the body, and says:

PRAYERS FOR THE SUFFERING SOULS IN PURGATORY



Only the faithful (members of the Catholic Church) can help the souls in purgatory by their prayers, alms, penances, and other good works. An inquirer or catechumen who prays for the poor souls will personally benefit from these prayers, but his prayers will not be able to help the poor souls.

The faithful who die in a state of grace but are guilty of venial sins or have not expiated all the punishments due to their remitted sins go to purgatory. They cannot enter heaven until their venial sins and all of the punishments due to their sins are remitted. These souls are known as the faithful departed or the suffering souls or the poor souls. For the dead to be numbered among the faithful departed, they must have died as one of the faithful and in a state of grace. Therefore, if there is credible evidence that they died as non-members of the Catholic Church or in any mortal sin, then it is

Prayer for the Poor Souls when Visiting Their Grave

Make the Sign of the Cross: In the name of the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen. (*sprinkling the grave with Holy Water*)

If the poor soul is a female, replace he with she, him with her, etc. If there are more than one poor soul, then replace he with them, his with their, etc.

L. Let us pray: O God, the Creator and Redeemer of all the faithful, hear our supplications and through thy infinite love and mercy graciously grant to the soul of thy departed servant the remission of his sins and punishment due to his sins, by which presumed that they are not among the faithful departed and thus cannot be prayed for.

The faithful on earth are obliged in charity and justice to pray for the poor souls. Those who in this life forget or ignore the faithful departed and thus do not pray for them will not save their souls when they die. Divine justice will punish them with everlasting damnation in Gehenna for their cruelty and hardness of heart, for not loving their brothers as God commanded as a necessity for salvation. Jesus said, "A new commandment I give unto you: That you love one another, as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this shall all men know that you are my disciples, if you have love one for another." (Jn. 13:34-35) Hence, whoever shows no mercy toward the suffering souls and remains cold and indifferent to their pain shall suffer everlasting fire in Gehenna in which there is no relief.

Second Prayer

I adore, salute, and praise thee, O sweetest Lord Jesus Christ, and I give thee thanks for all the love and the faithfulness with which thou didst overcome death and rise from the dead and glorify our flesh by ascending in it to the right hand of the Father, beseeching thee that thou wouldst vouchsafe to render the soul for which I pray partaker of thy triumph and thy glory. Amen.

L. I adore, salute, and praise thee, O sweetest Lord Jesus Christ, and I render thee thanks for all the graces thou hast ever bestowed on thy glorious Mother and on all thine elect, in union with the gratitude with which all thy saints exult in the bliss thou hast obtained for them through thy holy incarnation, Passion, and resurrection, beseeching thee that thou wouldst vouchsafe to supply to this soul from the merits and prayers of the same glorious Virgin and all thy saints whatever is lacking to his own. The Lord's Prayer for the Faithful Departed

Our Father, who art in heaven. I beseech thee that thou wouldst forgive the souls in purgatory whereinsoever they neither

sufficiently loved nor worthily honored thee, their adorable and most beloved Father, who of thine own mere grace didst adopt them to be thy children and they thrust thee forth from their hearts in which thou didst delight to dwell. And in satisfaction for these their sins, I offer thee that love and honor which thy beloved Son showed thee upon earth, and that most abundant satisfaction which he hath made for all their sins. Amen.

Hallowed be thy name. I beseech thee, O thou Father of compassion, forgive the souls of the faithful departed whereinsoever they did not worthily honor nor daily make mention of thy holy name, but took it in vain. In satisfaction for these their sins, I offer thee the consummate holiness of thy Son whereby he magnified thy name by his teaching and made it honorable by his work. Amen.

Thy kingdom come. I beseech thee, O Father of compassion, vouchsafe to forgive the souls of the faithful departed whereinsoever they did not fervently long nor ardently strive after thee and thy kingdom, in which alone is true rest and abiding glory. And for this and all their sloth in doing good, I offer thee the most holy and longing desires of thy Son wherewith he desired to make them heirs of his kingdom together with him. Amen.

Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. I beseech thee, O Father of compassion, vouchsafe to forgive the souls of the faithful departed, and especially of those consecrated to thee in the religious life, whereinsoever they did not prefer thy will above their own or did not love it in all things but too often lived and did only according to their own will. And in satisfaction for this their disobedience, I offer thee the union of the sweetest heart of thy Son with thy will, and all his most ready and loving obedience wherewith he was obedient unto thee, even to the death of the cross. Amen.

Give us this day our daily bread. I beseech thee, O Father of compassion, vouchsafe to forgive the souls of the faithful departed whereinsoever they did not receive the most blessed and adorable

Sacrament of the Altar with pure and perfect desire, devotion, and love or received it unworthily or seldom. And in satisfaction for these their sins, I offer thee the consummate holiness and devotion of thy Son, together with that most ardent love and ineffable yearning desire wherewith he bestowed upon us this most inestimable treasure. Amen.

And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. I beseech thee, O Father of compassion, to forgive the souls of the faithful departed; vouchsafe to remit their sins and punishment due to their sins, and especially whereinsoever they did not forgive those who trespassed against them, or did not love their enemies. And for all these their sins, I offer thee that most sweet and tender prayer which thy Son prayed to thee for his enemies while he hung on the cross. Amen.

And let us not fall into temptation. I beseech thee, O Father of compassion, vouchsafe to forgive the souls of the faithful departed whereinsoever they did not resist their concupiscence and the sins to which they were especially prone but again and again consented to the devil and the flesh and entangled themselves by their own will in many grievous evils. And for all these their manifold sins, I offer thee the glorious victory wherewith thy Son overcame the world and the devil, together with all his most holy life and conversation, his toil and weariness, his most bitter Passion and death. Amen.

But deliver us and them from every evil and every woe, through the merits of thy beloved Son, and bring us to the kingdom of thy glory.

Amen.

Prayer to Jesus for the Faithful Departed

O most compassionate Jesus, have mercy on the souls detained in purgatory, for whose redemption thou didst take upon thee our nature and endure a bitter death. Mercifully hear their groanings, look with pity on the tears which they now shed before thee, and by virtue of thy Passion release them from the pains due unto their sins. O Jesus, full of pity for the poor souls, let thy precious blood reach down into purgatory and refresh and revive the captive souls which suffer there. Stretch forth unto them thy strong right hand and bring them forth into the place of refreshment, light, and peace. Amen.

Prayer Addressed to the Faithful Departed

O most afflicted souls, may Jesus Christ have mercy upon you, who for you was crucified and died; and may he refresh you in your sufferings by the sprinkling of his precious blood. I commend you to that exceeding love which drew down the Son of God from heaven to redeem men, to endure a most bitter death on earth, that in that amazing compassion wherewith he entered into and took upon himself all the afflictions of the afflicted he may have compassion on you. And for your full solace and refreshment, I offer you all that filial love which the same Jesus Christ felt toward the Father in his divinity and toward Mary in his humanity. Amen.

Prayer to the Heart of Jesus

O gentlest heart of Jesus, ever present in the Blessed Sacrament, ever consumed with burning love for the poor captive souls in purgatory, have mercy on the souls of thy departed servants, be not severe in thy judgments, but let some drops of thy precious blood fall upon the devouring flames. And do thou, O merciful Savior, send thy angels to conduct thy departed servants to a place of refreshment, light, and peace. Amen.

May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

Merciful Jesus, grant unto them everlasting rest.

Prayer for Mercy on the Souls in Purgatory

My Jesus, by the sorrows suffered by thee in thine agony in the garden, in thy scourging and crowning with thorns, in thy way to Calvary, in thy crucifixion and death, have mercy on the souls in purgatory, especially those that are most forsaken. Deliver them from the dire torments they endure. Call them and admit them to thy most sweet embrace in heaven. Amen.

Thirty-Day Prayer for the Souls in Purgatory

<u>DAY 1</u>—The Dogmas on Heaven, Purgatory, and Gehenna

The destiny awaiting us at death is not the same for all men, for God "will render to every man according to his works." (Rom. 2:6) Heaven, purgatory, or Gehenna are the three places to which the souls of the departed go. Heaven is the place of everlasting bliss for holy and pure souls, for "there shall not enter into it anything defiled" (Apoc. 21:27), for "who shall ascend into the mountain of the Lord: or who shall stand in his holy place? The innocent in hands and clean of heart." (Ps. 23:3-4) Gehenna is the place of everlasting torments for reprobates. At their particular judgment Jesus shall say to them: "Depart from me, you cursed, into everlasting fire which was prepared for the devil and his angels." (Mt. 25:41) Purgatory is the place for holy souls who are not yet purified and need to be cleansed in God's avenging fire, for they cannot enter heaven until they have perfectly satisfied God's justice: "Amen I say to thee, thou shalt not go out from thence till thou repay the last farthing." (Mt. 5:26)

To be holy, one must be in a state of grace; that is, not guilty of original sin or mortal sin. Only the faithful can be holy and thus in a state of grace because all non-members of the Catholic Church are guilty of either original sin or mortal sin or both.

However, to be perfect one must not only be in a state of grace but must be free from venial sin and have all the punishment due to his sins remitted. Catholics who die in a state of grace but are guilty of venial sins or have not expiated all the punishment due to their remitted sins go to purgatory. They cannot enter heaven until their venial sins and all the punishment due to their sins are remitted. When Jesus

said that there are some sins which will not be forgiven "neither in this world, nor in the world to come" (Mt. 12:32), he implied that in the world to come, after death, there are some sins that will be forgiven. The sins that will be forgiven after death are the venial sins of Catholics in purgatory who are thus in a state of grace.

The souls in heaven and purgatory no longer have the concupiscence of the flesh, are no longer tempted, and will no longer sin.

The souls in purgatory are among the faithful departed and are known as the poor souls or the suffering souls. For the dead to be numbered among the faithful departed, they must have died not only as members of the Catholic Church but also in a state of grace. Hence if there is credible evidence that they died as nonmembers of the Catholic Church or in any mortal sin, then they are presumed to be in Gehenna and not of the faithful departed and thus cannot be prayed for. And even if there is credible evidence that one of the faithful died in the state of grace, there is no certainty that he is saved because he may have been guilty of secret mortal sin.

The souls in purgatory cannot help themselves; but the faithful on earth can help them by prayers, penances, alms, and other good works. Thus the faithful on earth are obliged in charity and justice to pray for the poor souls.

Prayer: Graciously hear, O God, the fervent prayers we offer thee for the suffering souls in purgatory, who not having satisfied thy divine justice have confidence in thy mercy and our intercessions. Extend unto them thy mercy, remit their venial sins and punishment due to their sins, and grant them thy consolations. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls in purgatory who need their venial sins remitted.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: Examine how often and in what manner during the year you

have prayed for the souls in purgatory.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 2</u>—Commemoration of "All Souls in Purgatory Day"

The commemoration of All Souls in Purgatory Day was instituted by the Catholic Church as a day of special prayer for all the faithful departed who are as yet deprived of the blissful contemplation of God and the possession of heaven. These holy souls endure their sufferings and count the lingering moments of time while waiting release from this prison or at least some relief from their pain. They have special confidence in their friends and relatives who are among the faithful upon earth, hoping to be lovingly cherished in their memory and aided by their fervent prayers. With holy Job they cry out: "Have pity on me, have pity on me, at least, you my friends, because the hand of the Lord hath touched me." (Job 19:21)

The commemoration of All Souls in Purgatory Day should serve to revive and confirm our devotion on behalf of the suffering souls in purgatory. If we have been negligent in our duty toward them during the year, we must now confess this sin and amend our ways by praying for the poor souls not only once or twice a year but during the whole year.

Prayer: O God, the Creator and Redeemer of all men, grant to the souls of thy servants departed remission of their sins and punishment due to their sins, that by the pious supplications of the faithful they may graciously obtain the pardon they desire. Who livest and reignest forever and ever. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls of those who suffer the greatest torments in purgatory.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: Attend a Catholic public devotion for the suffering souls (if a public devotion is available).

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 3</u>—Our Duty to Relieve the Souls in Purgatory

The communion of saints is one of the most consoling dogmas of the Catholic Church. The saints in heaven, the faithful upon earth, and the souls in purgatory are all members of one great family. Mutual charity becomes an obligation by this perfect bond which unites the Suffering Church in purgatory and the Triumphant Church in heaven with the Militant Church upon earth, incorporating them into one body, the Holy Catholic Church. This bond of love demands that all Catholics on earth must pray for one another and to the saints in heaven; the faithful must pray for the poor souls in purgatory; the poor souls in purgatory must pray for the Catholics on earth and to the saints in heaven; and the saints in heaven must pray for the Catholics on earth and for the poor souls in purgatory. In these prayers, offered mutually, Christian charity is most beautifully and eloquently expressed.

From this obligation we derive the special duty to pray for the suffering souls in purgatory, who are unable in their extreme distress to do anything for their own relief. It is a dogma of the Catholic Church that the faithful on earth, as well as the saints in heaven, can assist the poor souls in purgatory. We must offer our petitions for the suffering souls in purgatory, that God in his goodness and mercy may mitigate and shorten their punishment and hasten their entrance into heaven. It is a dogma of the Catholic Church that by the intercession of the faithful upon earth God remits the venial sins of the poor souls, remits the punishments due to their sins, and relieves their sufferings. "In this," says the Catholic catechism, "the supreme goodness and mercy of God deserve our grateful acknowledgment and praise, that he has granted to our frailty the privilege that one may satisfy for another."

Prayer: O Lord Jesus Christ, thou who hast said "Where there are two or three gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them" (Mt. 18:20), look mercifully upon thy Holy Catholic Church, who

implores thy clemency on behalf of her suffering members in purgatory. End their intense pain and open unto them the portals of the heavenly Jerusalem so that they may praise thee in heaven, forever and ever. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the poor souls who during the course of their earthly lives did much to relieve the souls in purgatory.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: Be conscientious and faithful in the performance of little duties and offer them for the relief of the suffering souls.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy! DAY 4—The Sins of the More Mighty

The judgments of God are often different from the judgments of men: "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor your ways my ways, saith the Lord. For as the heavens are exalted above the earth, so are my ways exalted above your ways, and my thoughts above your thoughts." (Isa. 55:8-9) Though the judgments of God are severe, they are ever just. Where grace has been augmented, there also the account has been increased. "Unto whomsoever much is given, of him much shall be required." (Lk. 12:48) From those souls upon whom God has bestowed great and special graces, he demands a more faithful cooperation; and the least infidelity to such grace is punished with extreme severity. "A greater punishment is ready for the more mighty." (Wis. 6:9) Hence the sins of the more mighty (the prelates, priests, theologians, and secular rulers) are punished more severely than those who were not as highly privileged, such as laymen.

Prayer: O Lord, have mercy on the poor souls unto whom much was given and grant them remission of their sins and punishment due to their sins. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls in purgatory to whom much was given.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (three times)

Practice: Do not let human respect prevent you from performing a duty.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

DAY 5—The Sufferings of Purgatory

The sufferings of purgatory are twofold: the pain of loss and the pain of the senses, both in proportion to temporal punishment unremitted. Having committed sin, the soul has turned away from God and therefore God deprives it of his beatific vision by delaying its entrance into heaven, which increases the pain of loss.

By sin the soul has been inordinately attached to creatures, making improper use of them, which is displeasing to God, and hence the severe punishment consisting in the pain of the senses. Thus even though the mortal sins of the poor souls have been remitted, God nevertheless punishes them for having "served the creature rather than the Creator." (Rom. 1:25) God permits them to be chastised by the very things they had put above him, by the very things by which they sinned. "By what things a man sinneth, by the same also he is tormented." (Wis. 11:17) For example, the mouths of those who blasphemed, the eyes that gazed upon evil things, the hands that stole or murdered—these will all be tormented in purgatory.

The sufferings of the senses in purgatory consist of fire, hideous sights and sounds, disgusting odors, and other torments which differ depending on how much these souls need to be purified.

Prayer: O Lord, by thy love and clemency graciously grant to the suffering souls in purgatory remittance of their venial sins and punishment due to their sins. Receive them into thy eternal glory, that blessed by thy beatific vision they may praise and adore thee in heaven, forever and ever. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls who have suffered for the longest time in purgatory.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: Mortify your prevailing weakness or inclination.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

DAY 6—The Pain of Loss

The spiritual suffering of the pain of loss is the greatest pain in purgatory according to the Fathers of the Church. No one can comprehend the great sufferings of a soul departed which in all its ardent desire for the highest and only good sees itself repulsed as an object of God's avenging justice. Far greater than the pain of the senses in purgatory is the pain which the holy souls must endure in being deprived of the vision of God. Because these souls. inflamed not only with a natural but also a supernatural love of God, are so vehemently attracted to the union with their highest good that in being repulsed through their own fault they experience so violent a pain as would kill them instantly if death were possible to them. Therefore this pain of being deprived of God is a far greater pain to them than the pain of the senses.

Prayer: O God, Father of mercies, grant the ardent desire of the souls in purgatory, who yearn to behold thee. Send down to them thy holy angel with the joyful tidings at the moment of their release, when their exile has ended, and bless them with perfect union with thee forever. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls who are punished for their forgetfulness of the holy presence of God during their lives.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: Try to remember at all times the holy presence of God.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

DAY 7—Pain of Sorrow for Sin

The soul departed, when summoned before the judgment seat of God, is

enlightened with a perfect knowledge of the purity and sanctity of its divine Judge and clearly perceives the stains with which it is sullied and its extreme unworthiness of union with God. The thought that "I have offended God, who is everlasting beauty and perfection, and I am not yet worthy to appear before the face of the Lord, who is infinitely holy. and thus I am not worthy to take possession of my dwelling place in heaven" is the greatest sorrow of the suffering souls. Much more clearly than during their earthly lives do these holy souls comprehend the perfections of God and love him above all things; therefore the thought of having offended him is a piercing sorrow which surpasses all their other sufferings.

One of the greatest agonies is remorse of conscience for sin. There are examples on record of men who died from the effects of this vehement sorrow; yet how much more intense must be the contrition of the suffering souls in purgatory, who fully understand the great malice of sin! We know by our own experience that the depth of sorrow for having offended a person is equal to the love we bear him; therefore the greatest sorrow of the poor souls is for having offended God, whom they love above all things with a perfect love and thus with perfect contrition.

Prayer: O God, Father of grace and mercy, graciously regard the deep sorrow of the suffering souls in purgatory. Deign to accept their love; and grant them remission of their venial sins and punishment due to their sins, that united with thee they may praise thy goodness forever. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls in purgatory who when they lived did not have a sufficient fear and love of God and a horror of the sins they committed.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: Be sorry for the sins you have committed. For penance, whip yourself with a cord or belt ten times on each side of your back, three times

throughout the day. If this is not possible, then replace this penance with an equivalent form of mortification.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 8</u>—Pain of Helplessness and Desolation

The souls in purgatory have entered into the realm of divine justice. The penance and satisfaction due for their sins must be made either by the pain of purgatory itself or by the suffrages of the faithful, consisting in prayer, penance, alms, and other good works offered on their behalf, since the suffering souls can no longer earn merit for themselves and thus are entirely unable to assist themselves. Hence for them "the night hath come in which no man can work." (John 9:4) The suffering souls, then, have no resource but that of patience, resignation, and hope.

In bestowing charity upon a person, we are usually guided by the degree of his poverty; but who is in such great need as he who possesses absolutely nothing, owes a heavy debt, is unable to labor or gain any merit or even to beg, and must nevertheless suffer torments until the last farthing has been paid? A sick man and a beggar can at least cry out for help, and the very sight of their misery will move others to compassion; but the suffering souls are not seen by us and cannot ask for our help, for the instances in which they have been permitted to implore aid of the living are exceptional cases and very few are on record. In their extreme desolation and distress, they incessantly cry out to us for relief and assistance; but since they cannot do this in a manner perceptible to us, Holy Church does it for them by instituting many touching devotions on their behalf. How could we be devoid of all sympathy for them in their sufferings and leave them in their pain and anguish! Hence "restrain not grace from the dead." (Eccus. 7:37)

Prayer: Have mercy, O Lord, upon the suffering souls in purgatory; and in their helplessness and desolation comfort them by the prayers and petitions of the angels and saints in heaven and the faithful on earth.

Shorten the time of their suffering, and reward them with joys everlasting. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the most forsaken and helpless souls in purgatory.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (three times)

Practice: When possible, visit a Catholic cemetery and pray for the faithful departed who may be buried there.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

DAY 9—Pain of Fire in Purgatory

It is a dogma that the fire in purgatory is real material fire and thus not symbolic. Therefore what St. Paul writes to the Corinthians, "But he himself shall be saved, yet so as by fire" (1 Cor. 3:15), must be taken in a literal sense.

Hence, besides being deprived of the vision of God, souls in purgatory endure the tortures of fire, the effects of which are much more painful since it is an instrument in the avenging hand of God, a fire in comparison to which our material fire on earth is nothing, a fire that entirely penetrates the soul in whatever manner this may be accomplished. How and to what extent this is done, we know not; but we may draw our conclusions from similar instances. In like manner the fallen angels, although pure spirits, are tormented by the material fire of Gehenna, so may a similar fire torture the souls of the departed in purgatory. The justice of God can punish a spirit by means of material substance, as he can also in his omnipotence give life to a body by the agency of a spirit. According to the Holy Fathers, the fire of purgatory does not differ from the fire of Gehenna except in duration. The same fire that torments the reprobate in Gehenna also torments the just in purgatory; and the deeper the soul is in Gehenna or purgatory, the more intense the fire.

The only thing that makes the fire in purgatory more bearable than the fire in Gehenna is God's grace, which helps the poor souls endure the fire and gives them occasional relief.

Prayer: Refresh, O Lord, the suffering souls in purgatory with the dew of thy grace so that their pains may be relieved; and in thy mercy hasten the moment of their deliverance, that they may meet thee in heaven, where no fire but that of thy holy love shall consume them. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls in purgatory who suffer the most pain in God's avenging fire.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: Endeavor to spread the devotion for the holy souls as much as possible.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 10</u>—The Duration of Time Spent in Purgatory

The poor souls do not stay in purgatory forever. Concerning the duration of time to be spent in purgatory, we are not informed of the length of time required for the purification of a soul. The soul, to be reunited to its Creator in heaven, must be in the state of primitive innocence which adorned Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden before they sinned. The likeness of God must be entirely restored within the soul before it can enter into the glory and holiness awaiting it in heaven.

From this it is evident that the suffering souls cannot enter heaven until perfectly cleansed either by their pains or by the prayers and suffrages of the faithful. With the Royal Prophet they cry out in plaintive voice: "As the hart panteth after the fountains of water, so my soul panteth after thee, O God! When shall I come and appear before the face of God?" (Ps. 41:2-3) They suffer until entirely purified, until the last farthing of their debt has been discharged.

Prayer: O God, the dispenser of pardon and salvation, we beseech thee, by the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary and all thy

saints, to grant relief to the poor souls in purgatory who are suffering in the cleansing flames of thy justice. Have mercy on them, O Lord, and bring them to the joys of everlasting bliss. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls in purgatory who are most desirous of obtaining help from you.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: Be not overly anxious about things you have no power over.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 11</u>—Our Duty to Relieve Our Suffering Relatives in Purgatory

There is a universal law to assist the needy which extends even to strangers. How much more, then, are we obliged to help the souls in purgatory who were intimately connected with us and who suffer, perhaps, for having loved us excessively.

If there be among the faithful departed our fathers, mothers, brothers, sisters, and other relatives, how exceedingly painful for them to be forgotten and deserted even by those whose happiness they promoted during their sojourn upon earth. Were any of these persons afflicted with the least pain while they lived, we would have done all in our power to relieve them; but now that they have departed from us, shall we leave them in their terrible sufferings and anguish? Can we be cold and heartless toward these souls and devoid of all sympathy for them? "A hard heart shall fear evil at the last." (Eccus. 3:27)

Prayer: O Lord, revive within the hearts of thy faithful an active sympathy for their faithful departed brethren, that these souls may not, by our indifference or neglect, suffer without relief and assistance. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls in purgatory who have been forgotten by their relatives who are of the faithful.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: Suffer patiently any inconveniences throughout the day and any disagreeable occurrences in your dealings with others and offer them for the poor souls.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 12</u>—The Special Duty to Aid Our Faithful Departed Friends and Benefactors

Besides the general duty imposed upon us by the divine law of charity to pray for the souls in purgatory, we are obliged especially to pray for our friends and benefactors who are numbered among the faithful departed.

What could more forcibly elicit our charity and gratitude than to behold our friends and benefactors in extreme distress while we have the means of alleviating their sufferings! He who by neglect or indolence suffers the souls of his friends to be tormented in the flames of purgatory without relief does not possess a spark of Christian charity!

Prayer: Have mercy, O Lord, upon the suffering souls in purgatory; mitigate the severity of thy judgment, that they, who during their earthly lives believed in thee, hoped in thee, and loved thee, may soon receive the crown of justice in heaven. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls in purgatory who have been forgotten by their friends and beneficiaries who are of the faithful.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: Deny yourself a little comfort or some special consolation and offer it for the most forsaken souls in purgatory.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 13</u>—Our Duty toward Our Faithful Departed Parents

"Honor thy father, and forget not the groanings of thy mother. Remember

that thou hadst not been born but through them, and make a return to them as they have done for thee." (Eccus. 7:29-30)

The duty to love and pray for our father and mother extends beyond this life if they are counted among the faithful departed. Should they find no relief in their pains? Must they cry out in bitter anguish: "I have reared sons and daughters, but they have forgotten me!"

Oh, let us remember how near and dear our faithful departed fathers and mothers are to us and how greatly we are indebted to them. They cry out to us for mercy. After their death we owe them prayers, penances, alms, Masses, and other good works. Would it not be the highest degree of ingratitude to forget them in their need? How painful for them to see their possessions left to their children while they themselves receive not the benefit of the least farthing thereof! God's commandment "Honor thy father and thy mother" is an obligation also toward our faithful departed parents.

Prayer: O God, who has commanded us to honor father and mother, look with loving kindness upon the fathers and mothers in purgatory and have mercy on them. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls of parents in purgatory who have been forgotten by their children who are of the faithful.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: Mortify yourself by an act of obedience.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 14</u>—Grand Display Is of No Value to the Holy Souls

In regard to pompous displays for the faithful departed, costly funerals and expensive displays may afford the living some consolation but are of no benefit to the departed. Let care be bestowed upon funerals and the erection of monuments, for Holy Writ reckons these among good works, and

let the living perform these last services for the faithful departed and thereby relieve their own sorrow; but let them show greater zeal, care, and generosity in succoring these souls by Masses, prayers, penances, and alms, thus giving evidence not only of a temporal but also a spiritual love for those who are departed.

Prayer: We beseech thee, O Lord, by thy mercy, hear and answer our prayers on behalf of the souls in purgatory and grant them peace and consolation. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls of those who were remembered by a pompous funeral only and have no relief in their pain.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: If possible, at the first opportunity accompany the funeral of a poor person who is of the faithful departed.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 15</u>—The Better Our Dispositions and Intentions Are, the More Merit We Can Earn for the Poor Souls

Holy Church teaches us that some prayers and other good works gain more merit than others depending on the dispositions and intentions of the one who offers them. Hence the more pure and holy our dispositions and intentions are, the more merit is gained for the poor souls. And the more we overcome our inordinate desires here upon earth, the more efficacious our prayers will be for the suffering souls in purgatory.

Prayer: Grant us the grace, O Lord, to offer our prayers and other good works with a good disposition and intention, that by thy bounty our supplications for the suffering souls may be more acceptable to thee and more beneficial to them. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the suffering souls who on earth prayed with poor dispositions and intentions for the souls in purgatory.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (three times)

Practice: Endeavor to make an act of perfect contrition.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 16</u>—The Efficacy of Prayer for the Suffering Souls

"It is therefore a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead that they may be loosed from sins." (2 Mach. 12:46) Prayer for the dead is holy because it is pleasing to God; wholesome, because through the merciful goodness of God it accomplishes its sublime and charitable object. Our sacrifices of love and mercy are very pleasing to God especially when offered for the suffering souls, whom he loves most tenderly because they are holy and sure of heaven.

To relieve the suffering souls, we can gain merit for them by our prayers, petitions, sacrifices, alms, and other good works on their behalf.

Prayer: Open, O Lord, the rich treasures of the Catholic Church in favor of the souls in purgatory, that they may receive pardon, in full or in part, and grant them relief in their pains. We beseech thee to grant us the graces to deliver and comfort a great number of suffering souls by prayer and other good works. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the poor souls who during their lives endeavored to gain many merits for the faithful departed.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: Pray the <u>Prayer to Jesus for</u> the Faithful <u>Departed</u>, p. 180.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 17</u>—How God Bestows Our Merits upon the Souls in Purgatory

God uses the Catholic Church's treasure of merits gained by the faithful for the poor souls according to his will. God has reserved to himself the right to accept entirely or

in part the satisfaction offered for any soul in purgatory. The acceptance depends upon God's holy and adorable will and, in great measure, upon the soul having rendered itself worthy of the divine assistance during its earthly career. Besides, there may be some dispositions or intentions neglected by the person who intends to gain merits for the poor souls; therefore we have no assurance whatsoever that the merits earned for the poor souls have had the desired effect. Considering this, we should prepare most carefully our dispositions and intentions for gaining merits for the poor souls.

Prayer: Have mercy, O Lord, upon the suffering souls in purgatory and mitigate the severity of thy judgment. Let the infinite merits of thine onlybegotten Son, the merits of thy saints, and our merits assist the holy souls and deliver them from their sufferings. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the poor souls who while they lived did not sufficiently gain merits for the souls in purgatory.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: Offer for the souls in purgatory all the merits you can gain today.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 18</u>—The Efficacy of Holy Mass for the Faithful Departed

The Sacrifice of the Mass is the greatest devotion and source of grace in the Catholic Church, for there Jesus Christ himself offers his infinite merits to his heavenly Father, by the hands of the priest. The unbloody Sacrifice of the Mass does not essentially differ from the bloody Sacrifice of the Cross except in the mode of oblation; and of all the means to assist the souls in purgatory, none is more valuable or meritorious than a Mass offered on behalf of the suffering souls.

We may not infer that the offering of one Mass is sufficient to release a soul from purgatory. The merits of Jesus Christ are applied according to his adorable will, according to his justice and mercy, for the ways of God are often inscrutable.

It is therefore very salutary to have the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass offered at least once a year for the repose of a soul.

Prayer: O Lord Jesus Christ, who didst institute the unbloody Sacrifice of the Mass in commemoration of thy Sacrifice on the Cross, we beseech thee to bestow the merits of this Holy Sacrifice upon the souls in purgatory that they may soon be released from their pains. Who livest and reignest forever and ever. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls in purgatory who were most zealous to attend Mass.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: If possible, assist at Mass for the relief of the suffering souls (if a Catholic Mass is available).

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 19</u>—Holy Communion Is of Great Benefit to the Faithful Departed

Let our love and compassion for our neighbor lead us to the holy altar, for nothing is so well calculated to obtain everlasting rest for the holy souls. A pious servant of God beheld in a vision a departed friend, wrapped in flames, and learned from him that he suffered terribly because he received our Lord in Holy Communion with but little preparation. "Therefore," added this departed friend, "I beg you, for the love we bore each other, to communicate for the benefit of my soul; but do so with great preparation and fervor. I then hope to be released from the terrible sufferings that I have indeed well deserved for my negligence toward the Blessed Sacrament." The friend at once complied with the request; and after having received Holy Communion with due preparation, he saw the departed soul enveloped in light, winging its happy flight to heaven to behold face to face the King of eternal glory.

Prayer: O Lord Jesus Christ, who in the most Holy Sacrament of the Altar hast given us thine own flesh and blood as nourishment for our souls and bodies and a pledge of our own future resurrection, grant us the grace always to receive worthily this most holy Mystery that it may be a source of salvation to us and a relief to the souls in purgatory. Who livest and reignest forever and ever. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls in purgatory who were negligent in their preparation for Holy Communion.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (three times)

Practice: If possible, receive Holy Communion for the relief of the suffering souls (if not possible, then make a Spiritual Communion).

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 20</u>—Love of the Blessed Virgin Mary toward the Souls in Purgatory

When dying upon the cross, our divine Redeemer gave us Mary as a mother when he said to the beloved St. John, "Behold thy Mother." (Jn. 19:26-27) Hence the Blessed Virgin regards those who are of the faithful as her beloved children, and therefore she harbors tender feelings of maternal love toward her children who are suffering in purgatory. Let us give satisfaction to the Mother of love by offering abundant suffrages to her for the souls in purgatory.

Taking into consideration the great prerogatives of the Blessed Virgin and the infinite love of the Holy Trinity toward her, we cannot doubt that every soul in purgatory receives the greatest benefits by her merit and intercession. However, the Blessed Virgin does not pray to have all of these souls delivered at once, for her will is in perfect conformity to the will of God and she exercises her dominion over the souls in purgatory in perfect union with his divine will.

The text of Holy Writ has been applied to Mary: "I have walked in the waves of the sea." (Eccus. 24:8) She descends into the sea of fire, quenching the flames for the

suffering souls. It is said that the souls in purgatory experience the same joy and relief at the mere mention of her name that consoling words bring to the bedridden sick.

Prayer: O most holy and glorious Virgin Mary, blessed Mother of our Lord, we place our petitions for the suffering souls into thy hands. Cleanse our petitions from all imperfections, and by thy intercession obtain everlasting rest for the poor souls in purgatory. Through Jesus Christ, thy Son, our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls in purgatory who were most zealous in their devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: Pray the <u>Litany of the</u> <u>Blessed Virgin Mary</u>, p. 111, for the suffering souls in purgatory.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 21</u>—Efficacy of the Rosary for the Suffering Souls

The relief of the holy souls in purgatory is one of the effects of the Rosary. The Rosary is a powerful means to help the suffering souls. Therefore, if we wish to be of assistance to the souls in purgatory, we should recommend them often in our prayers to the Blessed Virgin Mary during the holy Rosary.

Prayer: O Lord, graciously hear the prayers we offer thee in the holy Rosary in honor of Mary, thy virgin Mother, for the relief of the souls in purgatory, while by devoutly meditating upon thy holy life and sufferings we implore thy divine assistance. Who livest and reignest forever and ever. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls in purgatory who were most devoted to the holy Rosary.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (three times)

Practice: Recite the Rosary for the suffering souls.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 22</u>—Alms-Giving Affords Great Relief to the Faithful Departed

Besides prayer and other acts of devotion, there are additional good works we can perform for the relief of the suffering souls in purgatory. Among these good works, almsgiving is one of the most prominent, for this being a work of mercy is especially efficacious in obtaining assistance for the holy souls. "Prayer is good with fasting and alms and righteousness. It is better to give alms than to lay up gold. For alms doth deliver from death and shall purge away all sin. Those that exercise alms and righteousness shall be filled with life." (Tob. 12:8-9)

Not only the rich are able to give alms but the poor can do so as well since it is not the value of the gift that is acceptable in the sight of God but the good intention by which it is bestowed.

If we, too, are numbered among the suffering souls in purgatory when we die, we will benefit from the alms we gave while we lived. And any of the faithful whom we assisted may be inspired to pray for our soul because of the charity we showed him upon earth. Therefore Holy Scripture says, "Do good to thy friend before thou die; and according to thy ability, stretching out thy hand, give to the poor." (Eccus. 14:13)

Prayer: O Lord, graciously look down upon the alms we offer for the relief of the captive souls in purgatory. Bestow upon these souls the full merit thereof that they may be able to discharge their debt. Accept this boon of charity, we beseech thee, that when they are delivered from debt and penalty thou mayest lead them into thy heavenly kingdom. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the poor souls who while they lived gave alms for the relief of the souls in purgatory.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: Bestow a gift upon a poor person and offer the merit for the souls in purgatory.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 23</u>—Works of Penance for the Holy Souls

The Catholic Church has at all times recommended to her children to have recourse to the works of penance as one of the best means of obtaining extraordinary graces from God, and these works of mortification are of great efficacy for the faithful departed. Works of penance and mortification are expected of everyone, and even the smallest acts are beneficial. There is no one who could not occasionally deny himself some favorite food or some amusement, mortify his eyes or ears or tongue, observe silence for a time, bear in patience the pain of sickness or heat or cold or any other adversity, or curb his self will—in short, bear with submission and gratitude to God everything that causes pain or distress.

Prayer: Grant us, O Lord, the grace to do works of penance and mortification and in these works to remember the souls in purgatory. Deign to accept what we offer in the spirit of charity for the comfort and relief of these penitent souls. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the poor souls who while they lived bestowed the merit of their mortifications upon the holy souls in purgatory.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: Perform an act of mortification for the souls in purgatory.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 24</u>—Value of Good Works Offered for the Suffering Souls

Even though our good and merciful Lord loves the souls of his elect who must be purified after death and ardently desires their release, in his justice he does not release them until full satisfaction has been made. Hence, when we appease God's justice by our prayers, penances, and other works of satisfaction for the poor souls, we not only hasten their release but it is as if we have delivered the Lord himself from a hard captivity. He promises to give us as full a recompense as such a work of mercy practiced toward himself would deserve, for he himself said "Amen, I say to you, as long as you do it to one of these, my least brethren, you did it to me." (Mt. 25:40) Whatever we do with a pious intention for the suffering souls will revert to our own merit and will be returned a hundredfold at the hour of our death.

Prayer: O God of love and mercy! Animated with charity and compassion for our faithful departed brethren, we offer thee our prayers and good works and supplicate thee to accept them as a propitiatory sacrifice on their behalf. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls in purgatory who were negligent in offering good works for the suffering souls.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: Bear your sufferings with patience and offer them for the holy souls.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 25</u>—Gratitude of the Holy Souls

The prayers and other works of charity which we offer for the suffering souls in purgatory not only increase our spiritual merit but also call forth the gratitude of the holy ransomed souls.

How can the faithful departed, who are loved by God so tenderly and predestined to glory, fail to be able to pray, not indeed for themselves because they are not in a condition to merit, but with efficacy for their benefactors on earth? They will speedily pay their debt of gratitude by their prayers and sufferings offered for those who befriend them; and their prayers and penances will have

great efficacy before God, whose greater honor and glory is promoted by their acts of charity.

And when these dear souls are by the help of our endeavors admitted to the vision of God, they cease not to prove the warmth of their thankfulness and love by imploring for us the help of which we are so much in need in the manifold dangers and great troubles of life. They will show their gratitude by their petitions for us before the throne of God according to the assistance we have given them in our earthly lives.

The assistance of the holy souls is also experienced in temporal wants in favor of their benefactors. These destitute, suffering souls do not wait until they enter heaven to exhibit their gratitude toward their benefactors. Whilst they still languish in purgatory, they pray for their benefactors' welfare of soul and body, recovery from disease, assistance in poverty, help in necessities, counsel and protection on journeys and in danger, and preservation and increase of their temporal goods; and above all, they aid them in the salvation of souls and come to their relief in their agonies of death and before the judgment seat of

Prayer: We beseech thee, O Lord, vouchsafe to hear the prayers of the suffering souls in purgatory who supplicate thee for their benefactors, that in union with these holy souls, for whom we offer our fervent prayers upon earth, we may praise thy mercies forever. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls in purgatory who suffer for the sins they committed by not doing works of charity when required.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: In spiritual and temporal wants, ask the holy souls to intercede for you.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 26</u>—By Helping to Deliver the Souls from Purgatory, We Promote the Honor of God

St. Paul the Apostle teaches that the honor and glory of God should be the principal motive of all our actions: "Whether you eat or drink or whatsoever else you do, do all to the glory of God." (1 Cor. 10:31) The glorification of God ought to be the special aim in our works for the faithful departed, and justly so, for by our assistance God delivers these poor souls and brings them to heaven, where God is perfectly known, loved, and glorified.

If the saints have declared their readiness to suffer all the tortures imaginable for the promotion of God's glory in a single degree, what should we do and suffer for the deliverance of these souls from the flames of purgatory since in heaven they will glorify God most perfectly forever!

Prayer: We thank and glorify thee, O Lord, for thy great mercy and goodness toward the poor souls in purgatory, who love thee and ardently desire to behold thee. Comfort them then, O Lord! Let them behold thy face in the land of the blessed, where they shall honor, praise, and glorify thee, forever and ever. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the suffering souls who while on earth zealously promoted the glory of God.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: During your next shower, use cold water for part of the time if possible. If not, then perform some other act of physical mortification and offer it for the poor souls in purgatory.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 27</u>—The Lord Rewards Our Acts of Charity for the Holy Souls

"Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy." (Mt. 5:7) He who bestows mercy upon the suffering souls shall himself, if he goes to purgatory, receive great relief and assistance there. Even though he

who satisfies for the suffering souls does not satisfy for himself, he performs a duty necessary for his own salvation, for if he should go to purgatory when he dies, God will see to it that the prayers of the faithful on earth will relieve him. Hence, by the mouth of the Royal Prophet, God declares: "Blessed is he that understandeth concerning the needy and the poor. The Lord will deliver him in the evil day." (Ps. 40:2)

Prayer: We beseech thee, O Lord, graciously hear the sincere and fervent prayers we offer for the souls in purgatory; and grant that the charity we extend toward our suffering brethren may obtain for us protection and help by their intercession. Through Christ our Lord, Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls in purgatory who are suffering for their want of gratitude when they lived.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: Pray the <u>Prayer Addressed</u> to the <u>Faithful Departed</u>, p. 181.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 28</u>—They Have Great Reason to Fear Who Show No Mercy toward the Faithful Departed

"With what measure you mete, it shall be measured to you again." (Mt. 7:2) It will be readily seen that these words of the divine Savior are applicable also to the assistance we should render the souls departed. He who in this life forgets the faithful departed and thus does not pray for them will not save his soul when he dies, for divine justice will punish with everlasting Gehenna his cruelty and hardness of heart. He will be damned to Gehenna forever for not loving his brothers as God commanded as a necessity for salvation. Jesus said, "A new commandment I give unto you: That you love one another, as I have loved you, that you also love one another. By this shall all men know that you are my disciples, if you have love one for another." (Jn. 13:34-35) Hence he who shows no mercy toward the suffering souls and remains cold and indifferent to their pain shall suffer everlasting fire in Gehenna in which there is no relief.

However, he who does not forget the suffering souls completely but seldom prays for them will get only as much help as he gave to the poor souls if he should go to purgatory. His complaints will be answered by the words of St. Paul: "He who soweth sparingly shall also reap sparingly." (2 Cor. 9:6)

Prayer: O God, in thy goodness and mercy have pity on the souls of those suffering in purgatory who on account of their want of charity when they lived are undeserving of thy bounty. Accept our fervent prayers in reparation for their lack of sufficient prayer and other good works for the poor souls. May they not suffer without consolation. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls of the faithful departed who while they lived did not sufficiently help the poor souls.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: Bear patiently the ingratitude of others and offer it for the souls in purgatory.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 29</u>—We Can Make Even Our Most Trivial Actions Beneficial for the Holy Souls

By performing even the most trivial actions from the motive to please our dear Lord and to do his holy will, these acts become meritorious. Any meritorious act, as trivial as it may be, can benefit the poor souls in purgatory. For instance, if we are working from early in the morning until late at night, we can assist the suffering souls in an efficacious manner by offering for their relief our toil and fatigue in union with the merits of Jesus and Mary. Sick

persons or those enduring spiritual sufferings, such as temptations, slander, or unjust treatment, may likewise benefit the poor souls by offering up these sufferings. Even a simple bump on the head or stubbing a toe can be offered up for the benefit of the poor souls. For example, we can offer up a prayer or other good work or pain for the poor souls by simply saying, "I offer this for the poor souls," or "For the love of Jesus and Mary, and the relief of the suffering souls in purgatory."

Prayer: My dear Redeemer! By neglecting to offer up my trivial good works for the poor souls, how many occasions have I lost to gain merits and thus to assist the poor souls! Pardon my negligence and graciously assist me in offering these actions for them. May my prayers, alms, spiritual and bodily sufferings, and other good deeds offered for the poor souls be united with thy merits and those of thy holy mother Mary and all the saints. In return I beseech the poor souls to obtain for me, and for all those for whom I pray, abundant graces to lead a holy life and to persevere to the end. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls in purgatory who were negligent in offering up their trivial actions for the faithful departed.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (*three times*)

Practice: Throughout the day, remember to offer up your trivial actions for the poor souls in purgatory.

Invocation: My Jesus, mercy!

<u>DAY 30</u>—Perseverance in Prayers for the Faithful Departed

The Holy Catholic Church, our good and tender Mother, most ardently desires that her children be admitted to the beatific vision of God and thus incessantly offers pious supplications during the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and the Divine Office to obtain mercy for the suffering souls. Holy Church thereby teaches us to think of the poor souls frequently, for they are suffering and in need of assistance and fervent prayers, which we should never fail to offer on their behalf.

The ways of God are often inscrutable, and his designs concerning the holy souls are unknown to us. Hence there may be among their number some who have a just claim on our assistance although a long time may have passed since the close of their earthly career. If our own beloved faithful departed are no longer in need of our assistance, our suffrages will be bestowed upon others who are deserving of our mercy as well; thus our prayers and labors of love will be salutary and meritorious for others.

Prayer: We beseech thee, O Lord, grant us the grace to persevere in our charity toward the souls in purgatory. Deign to look with eyes of mercy upon these penitent souls, deliver them from their sufferings, and open to them the portals of heaven. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Special Intercession: Pray for the souls in purgatory who suffer for their inconstancy in the service of God while they lived.

Everlasting rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them; may they rest in peace. Amen. (three times)

Practice: Now that this 30-day devotion has ended, do not forget the poor souls in purgatory. Pray daily for them. Examine your daily prayer schedule and make sure it includes sufficient prayers for the poor souls. Daily prayers for the poor souls can be prayers specifically for the poor souls, or they can be petitions incorporated into other prayers such as the holy Rosary or the Divine Office.

PRAYERS FOR THE REPENTANCE AND CONVERSION OF SINNERS

Prayer for the Conversion of Non-Catholic Rulers and Nations

O my Lord Jesus Christ, King of eternal glory, restorer of all things on earth, supreme and omnipotent, who with infinite wisdom re-unitest at thy feet things scattered and dispersed; enlighten the Kings of the earth, the rulers of nations; instill thy spirit into all civil institutions, into every legitimate form of government, into laws and armies; grant that all the powers of earth may recognize in thee the majesty of the eternal God, the source from which all authority is derived; illuminate the nations that they may understand that thou art the origin of rights and duties, that it is through thee that the Kings of the earth rule, and that it is to thee that Kings and people alike owe obedience. O most sweet Jesus, who hast deigned to descend into this valley of tears, and to dwell with us, suffering and dying for the salvation of us sinners, and who in charity hast set up thy abode in the midst of men, hidden under the sacramental species, and who in the fullness of the Godhead, corporally present in our tabernacles, makest thyself the food and life of our souls; oh, receive the humble but sincere and profound homage of our hearts, offered in reparation for the falling away of the rebellious. We firmly believe in thee and all that the faith infused into our hearts by the Holy Spirit has revealed to us about thee. We see in thee the beginning and the end of all existing things. We adore thee as the one true God. We wish to live only for thee and in thy service. Do thou, O Lord, save our brethren, convert the non-Catholic members of modern society gone astray, that we as brethren may together be one with thee, as thou art one with thy Father in Heaven. May thy will be done. May thy Majesty shine forth on the throne of thy earthly dominion, and the world confess thee to be the true Son of God, through whom all things were created. This we ask in thy name and

in the unity of the Father and Holy Spirit. Amen.

Prayer for the Conversion of Atheists, Pagans, and Heretics

O sweet Jesus, remember that the souls of atheists, pagans and heretics were made by thee and fashioned to thine own image. Behold, O Lord, how many of them go down to Gehenna to the dishonor of thy holy name. Remember the cruel death thou didst suffer for their salvation. Have mercy, O Lord, on them and graciously hear the prayers of thy Catholic Church, thy most holy spouse. Remember thy mercies and compassions. Give them the grace to repent of their atheism, idolatry, heresy, hardness of heart, and evil will. Give them grace at length to know, to fear, and to love thee, Jesus Christ our Lord, our salvation, our life and resurrection, through whom we are saved and made free, to whom be all glory for evermore. Amen.

Prayer for the Conversion of Unbelievers

O Holy Spirit of truth, we beseech thee to enlighten the minds of unbelievers, to incline their hearts to love thy word and to believe the teachings of thy Catholic Church; give them courage to accept the faith and openly profess it, that they may come into union with thee and the Father and the Son, who liveth and reigneth, one God, forever and ever. Amen.

Prayer for the Conversion of Sinners

Almighty and eternal God, who seeks not the death but the life of sinners, who would save all and have none to perish, mercifully hear our prayers on behalf of those who are dead in sin, and grant that they may repent and live in thy grace. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Prayer to Repent and Benefit from Punishments

(by St. Augustine)

Before thy eyes, O Lord, we bring our offences and we compare them with the stripes we have received. If we consider the evil we have wrought, what we suffer is little, what we deserve is great. What we have committed is very grave, what we have suffered is very slight. We feel the punishment of sin, yet withdraw not from the obstinacy of sinning. Under thy lash our inconstancy is visited, but our sinfulness is not changed. Our suffering soul is tormented, but our neck is not bent. Our life groans under sorrow, yet mends not in deed. If thou spare us, we correct not our ways; if thou punish, we cannot endure it. In time of correction, we confess our wrongdoing; after thy visitation, we forget that we have wept. If thou stretchest forth thy hand, we promise amendment; if thou withholdest the sword, we keep not our promise. If thou strikest, we cry out for mercy; if thou sparest, we again provoke thee to strike. Here we are before thee, O Lord, shameless criminals; we know that unless thou pardon, we shall deservedly perish. Almighty God, have mercy on us, pardon us, and grant us the grace and other helps we need to truly repent when punished. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

- L. Deal not with us, O Lord, according to our sins.
- **R.** Neither requite us according to our iniquities.

LET US PRAY: O God, who by sin art offended and by penance pacified, mercifully regard the prayers of thy suppliant people and turn away the scourges of thy wrath which we deserve for our sins. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Prayer When Severely Tempted to Sin

Lord God, help me! Come quickly to my aid. I am greatly tempted to sin.

Have mercy on me. Let me know for certain that this one sin, if it be mortal, will put me on the broad road to Gehenna, where I will suffer great pains forever and ever and ever if I commit this sin and do not repent. Help me to fear your judgment against me and also know that I am offending you who are all good and worthy of all love. I give you permission to forcibly stop me from sinning no matter what temporary deprivation or pain it may cause me, knowing that if I do not sin and am free from this great temptation, I will eventually be rewarded with the true peace and joy you promise to all those who faithfully and lovingly obey you. This I ask in the name of Jesus Christ, thy Son, in unity with thee and the Holy Spirit, one God. forever and ever. Amen. (RJMI)

Prayer to Overcome Stoicism

O God the Father, when you created all things through your only begotten Son, Jesus Christ, you "saw that they were good" (Gen. 1:31). Give me the grace to overcome my sin of stoicism so that I may truly enjoy in proper measure the good spiritual and material things and the good passions you created. Help me to not hate or despise them but to enjoy them

without any pang of guilt. Help me to know that if I do not enjoy them, I am condemning you, the author of all good things and good passions. This I ask through your Son, our Lord Jesus Christ, in unity with thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen. (RJMI)

Prayer for Those with an Addiction

O Lord Jesus Christ, you said: Ask and you shall receive, seek and you shall find, knock and it shall be opened to you, grant me the grace and other helps I need to overcome my addiction. I believe with my whole heart that you can cure me if I really want to be cured of this addiction. With my whole heart, I do want to be cured from it! Help me to hate it with a perfect hatred. And once cured, help me to moderate what is good and avoid what is evil. Help me to know that this one sin alone will send me to Gehenna forever where I will be tormented with excruciating pains, day and night, forever and ever. I ask for your help through the intercession of your holy mother Mary, the Mediatrix of All Graces; and the intercession of St. Jude, your Apostle, the patron saint of hopeless cases. O Lord, hear my prayer and let my cry

come unto you, who lives and reigns forever and ever. Amen. (RJMI)

Prayer to Repent and Be Freed from Homosexuality

O Lord Jesus Christ, through the intercession of your holy, pure, and ever-virgin mother, Marv Immaculate, grant me the grace and other helps I need to hate my homosexual sins of thought and deed with a perfect hatred. Help me that I may sincerely and with my whole heart confess these sins, repent, and amend my life. I know that you did not create men to be homosexuals and that it is your will that men do not commit these sins or any other sins. Hence I believe with my whole heart that by your grace and my cooperation I can be completely cured of this curse and sinful affliction. O Lord, you said: Ask and you shall receive, seek and you shall find, knock and it shall be opened to you. I ask, I seek, I knock. Please, I beg of you, free me from this filthy, impure sin against nature. Help me to know that this one sin alone will send me to Gehenna forever where I will be tormented with excruciating pains, day and night, forever and ever. O Lord Jesus Christ, I beseech your help, who lives and reigns forever and ever. Amen. (RJMI)

PRAYERS FOR THE MENTALLY ILL OR EMOTIONALLY DISTRESSED

Exorcism prayers are especially necessary to help cure the mentally ill from demonic possession or obsession

Prayer for Deliverance from Mental Illness

Almighty God the Father, I pray thee to remit the curse that (*N*.) is under either because of his own sins or the sins of others. Expel the demons that possess or obsess him, and thus bring him sanity and peace of heart and mind. Have mercy upon him and deliver him from mental illness, just as thou didst deliver the father's son from the lunatic spirit that possessed him (Mt. 17:14-17), the man from madness by sending the devils that possessed him into the swine (Mk. 5:1-16), and King Nabuchodonosor from madness and restored his senses by expelling the demons that possessed him (Dan. 4). We ask this in the name and by the power of God the Son, Jesus Christ, and in unity with God the Holy Spirit; and by the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, St. Joseph her spouse, and the Archangels St. Michael, St. Gabriel, and St. Raphael. Amen. (RJMI)

Prayer for Those with Alzheimer's Disease

Loving God, healer and comforter of the afflicted, we pray for (N) who suffers from the distress, anxiety, confusion, or isolation of Alzheimer's disease. Remit the curse that he is under either because of his own sins or the sins of others. In thy mercy, bring him sanity and peace of heart and mind by delivering him from Alzheimer's disease by expelling the demons that possess him. Grant that he may regain the use of reason so that he may have a chance to do whatever is necessary to be a good Catholic and thus have a hope to save his immortal soul. We make this supplication through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary; St. Joseph her spouse; the Archangels St. Michael, St. Gabriel, and St. Raphael; and in the name of Jesus Christ, thy Son, who livest and reignest with thee in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, forever and ever. Amen. (RJMI)

Prayer to St. Dymphna to Alleviate Emotional Distress



I turn to thee, St. Dymphna, dear virgin and martyr, confident of thy power with God and of thy willingness to take my cause into thy hands. I praise and thank the Lord for giving thee to us as a patron of the emotionally distressed. I firmly hope that through thy kind intercession he will restore my lost serenity and peace of heart and mind. May he speak to my heart and reassure me: "My peace I give you. Let not your heart be troubled, nor let it be afraid." Pray for me, dear St. Dymphna, that my emotional turmoil may cease and that I may again know serenity and peace. Amen.

Prayer for Those Contemplating Suicide

O Lord God, from whom all good thoughts proceed, I know that I cannot think or do anything good without thy grace. Have mercy on me, for I am in dire straits and in the depths of despair to the point of committing suicide. Please, Lord God, drive away the devils and my own pride and perverse will that are tempting me to take my own life.

Place in me thy grace, make me humble and penitent, give me peace of heart and mind, and make me know, and more importantly believe, that if I commit suicide I will suffer forever in Gehenna worse pains than anyone can suffer on earth. Help me to believe that suicide is not an escape but a trap to thrust me into Gehenna forever, where there is no peace of heart, mind, or body but only everlasting, excruciating torments. If thou wilt answer my prayer, I promise to do whatever I must to be a good Catholic so that I may be saved and be with thee forever, where there is no more pain, sadness, despair, sickness, or any other evil thing but only everlasting peace, happiness, joy, bliss, health, and all other good things. This I ask through Jesus Christ, thy Son our Lord, and by the mediation of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the intercession of St. Jude. Amen. (RJMI)

Prayer for Those in Mourning

Almighty God, who knowest the weakness and frailty of our nature, I beseech thee to give unto me, thy servant, whom thou hast stricken with this sorrow, such measure of thy grace as shall enable me to bear it with humility, resignation, and submission to thy divine will. Grant that no impatient murmuring or repining thoughts may find a place in my heart, that I may not sorrow as those who have no hope. Let not my grief exceed the bounds of reason and religion, but so temper it, I beseech thee, with the consolations of thy Holy Spirit, that whatever I may want in outward consolation I may find in the inward consolation of perfect submission to thy holy will and unshaken trust in thy loving mercy. Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Blessing of a Crucifix

LET US PRAY: O Holy Lord, almighty Father, eternal God, bless ★ this crucifix that it may be a saving help to mankind. Let it be a bulwark of faith, an encouragement to good works, the salvation of souls; and may it be consolation, protection, and a shield against the cruel darts of the enemy. Through Christ our Lord. R. Amen.

LET US PRAY: O Lord Jesus Christ. snatched the world from Satan's grasp and upon which, by thy suffering, thou hast overcome him who is the prompter of sin and who rejoiced in Adam's deception at the tree of paradise. (Here sprinkle the crucifix with holy water.) May this symbol of salvation be sanctified in the name of the Father, # and of the Son, ¥ and of the Holy ¥ Spirit; and may all who kneel and pray before this crucifix receive health of soul and body. Through the same Jesus Christ our Lord.

R. Amen.

The person who administered the blessing kneels before the crucifix and devoutly venerates and kisses it.

Blessing of a Rosary

To the honor and glory of the Virgin Mary, Mother of God, and in memory of the mysteries of the life, death, and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, may this rosary be blessed and sanctified. In the name of the Father, ♣ and of the Son, ♣ and of the Holy ♣ Spirit.

R. Amen.

Sprinkle the rosary with holy water.

Blessing of a Statue or Picture of God

Blessing of a Statue or Picture of the Blessed Virgin, an Angel, or a Saint

Blessing of Liturgical Incense

NOTE: Only liturgical incense is allowed; pagan or secular incense is forbidden.

The priest or head of the household blesses the incense:

By the intercession of blessed Michael the Archangel, standing at the right hand of the Altar of Incense, and of all his elect, may the Lord vouchsafe to bless & this incense and accept it as an odor of sweetness. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

May this incense which thou hast blessed, O Lord, ascend to thee; and may thy mercy descend upon us.

Let my prayer be directed as incense in thy sight, the lifting up of my hands as evening sacrifice. Set a watch, O Lord, before my mouth and a door round about my lips. Let not my heart turn aside to wicked deeds to make excuses for sins with men who work iniquity, nor let me associate with the choicest of them.

(Sprinkle the cord with Holy Water)

Receive this cord about thy loins, so that they may be girt with moderation, purity, and chastity, symbolized by the white. And may thy soul and body be girt to shed thy blood for Christ and thus die and kill for Christ if necessary, symbolized by the red. In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. R. Amen.

Blessing for Birthdays

Blessing by a priest or the head of the household:

May God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit bless you and grant you all the graces and other helps you need to save your soul. We thank God for creating and redeeming you; and we pray that you will cooperate with God's grace and other helps in order to give glory to God, to save your soul, and to help save the souls of others. (RJMI)

When prayed by yourself:

I thank you, God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit, for creating and redeeming me. I pray that I will cooperate with thy graces and other helps in order to give thee great glory, to save my soul, and to help save the souls of others. (RJMI)

Daily Blessing of Equipment

Can be prayed the first time you use any equipment during the day.

Bless these gifts, O Lord, that I have received from thy bounty, through Jesus Christ, thy Son our Lord. I beg of thee, O Lord God, to have mercy on me, that I may use these gifts and instruments thou hast given me primarily for thy greater glory and for no sinful purpose. And I beg of thee to have mercy on me, that thou wouldst appoint thy holy angels to protect these gifts and instruments thou hast given me so that the devils may not put their dirty, filthy, stinky, rotten paws upon them so as to interfere with this great and good work God hast given me. Amen. (RJMI)

Consecration of Equipment, Homes, or Property

For appliances, TV's, computers, cars, land, homes, etc. Pluralize if necessary.

This I ask through Jesus Christ thy Son who lives and reigns with thee in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen. (RJMI)
